This month you will begin to receive your election handbooks. This election there are 11 state propositions on the ballot. Locally, Martinez has Measure X on the ballot.

If approved by voters, Measure X provides local funds for Martinez's quality of life and essential services, including 911 response times and public safety, maintaining open space and recreational programs and addressing homelessness.

Measure X includes strict accountability provisions, such as independent citizen oversight of spending, public spending reports, and annual independent financial audits. And, all funds must be used only in Martinez.

VOTING INFORMATION

When is the election?

Election Day is November 6, 2018. The last day to register to vote is October 22, 2018.

When is the deadline to vote?

Remember, vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked by November 6th. The deadline to request a vote by mail ballot is October 30th - [visit www.cocovote.us](http://www.cocovote.us) or call (925) 335-7800. Your vote by mail ballot can also be dropped off at any polling place on Election Day.

When are polls open?
