

MCE Enrollment Timeline

Highlights:

- The City of Martinez **participated in a <u>technical study</u>** commissioned by the Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors to explore the formation of a joint-powers authority for purchasing electricity known as a community choice aggregation (CCA).
- The technical study included 14 communities and unincorporated Contra Costa County.
- The study investigated several CCA options: joining MCE, EBCE (a sister program of MCE), or creating a new Contra Costa organization.
- **Key findings** were that several CCA options existed that would likely result in *lower* greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, increased local renewable energy generation, and increased local job creation compared to remaining with current electricity service from the Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E).
- After considering the options, Martinez City Council voted to join MCE along with Contra Costa County and 6 other communities (Moraga, Danville, Oakley, Pittsburg, Pinole, Concord).
- The City of Martinez partnered with MCE to send water bill inserts explaining the details of the transition in service to all water customers in Martinez.
- MCE hosted and the City helped to publicize Community Leader Advisory Group Meetings, public presentations, and community workshops.
- The City website was updated to include <u>information on MCE</u>, including FAQ and links to MCE's website and call center information.
- By law (AB 117, 2002), all CCA's are opt-out programs. CCAs are also required to send four mailers to customers notifying them of the switch in their electricity generation. MCE began sending mailers in February of 2018.
- Customers were automatically enrolled in MCE's Light Green 50% Renewable service during their April billing cycle unless they opted up to 100% Renewable service, or chose to stay with PG&E.
- Martinez is home to Contra Costa County's first business to opt-up to 100%
 renewable energy, indoor play-center, #bouncefarm. MCE promotes businesses that
 support local energy resource development and sustainable energy by opting-up as
 Deep Green Champions.
