Background

- July 2019: Park parcel created as part of subdivision final map
- August 2021: Modified subdivision map approved, includes contribution for new park.
- February 2022: City Council approved Park Master plan and first phase design elements.
- September 2022: City approved naming policy for new city facilities.
- February 2023: City entered into agreement with DeNova to design for first phase of park project.

Design of Phase One park project 65% complete, reviewing layout of restroom building and playground options



Process for naming a new park

Three-step process for naming a new city facility

- Initial PRMCC meeting to receive presentation on new facility, community and public outreach process, and guidelines for submitting applications.
- Second PRMCC meeting with staff review of applications, input from historical experts if needed, and final name choice submitted to City Council.
- City Council meeting to determine recommendation from PRMCC and make a final vote for name of new facility.



Outreach Process

- Social Media
- City website posting
- City newsletter
- Local newspaper posting
- Mailers to nearby residents

How to Submit Application

- City website
- PDF Form emailed to City
- Paper application to City Hall

Outreach process will include dates for when to submit application and PRMCC review meeting



Next Steps/Schedule

- June 20, 2023: Meeting with PRMCC to initiate naming of new park.
- July 14, 2023: Complete outreach to community.
- August 25, 2023: Deadline for submission of applications.
- September 8, 2023: Staff completes review of applications.
- September 29, 2023: Staff receives input of applications from historical experts.
- October 17, 2023: Meeting with PRMCC to review applications/recommend name.
- November 15, 2023: Meeting with City Council to review PRMCC recommendation and approval final name of new City park.

Location of All-Abilities Playground

- Playground area approximately 5,900 square feet
- Adjacent to picnic tables and concrete pathway
- Designed for ages 5-12
- Accessibility and play area footprint
- City reached out to playground distributor for options
- Cost estimates includes materials, shipping, tax, installation



All-Abilities Playground: Option A



- 13 play components, 6 part of main structure
- More stand-alone equipment provides higher visibility
- Cost Estimate: \$260,000
- Main Structure Features:
 Canyon Climber, Crawl Tunnel, Play Panels,
 Plank Ladder, Ramp Access, Shade Toppers,
 Slide, Sunbeam Climber, Sway Fun
 - Stand-Alone Features:
 Cozy Dome, Curva Spinner, Omni Spinner
 (for ages 2-5), Multiple Types of Swings
 (Chain, Friendship, Harness, Oodle) Roller
 Table, Topsy Turner



All-Abilities Playground: Option A (Continued)





All-Abilities Playground: Option B



- 24 play components
- Mostly interconnected, fewer stand alone equipment
- Cost Estimate: \$345,000
- Main Structure Features:

 Block Climber, Conical Climber, Crawl Tunnel
 Horizontal Ladder, Plank Ladder, Play Panels,
 Pod Climber, Ramp Access, Roller Slide,
 Shade Toppers, Slide Winder, Sway Fun
- Stand-Alone Features:

 Cozy Dome, Sensory Play Wall, Omni
 Spinner (for ages 2-5), Oodle Swing, Topsy
 Turner

- City receives recommendation and prepare layout in final landscape plans and park project design
- Summer 2023: Final plans of Phase 1 park project, design reviewed by City
 Staff and Landscape Architect Consultant (rhaa)
- Fall 2023: City Council approvals plans of Phase 1 park project, developer to construct improvements
 - Site preparation, grading, drainage, utilities
 - Layout of pathways, playground area, restroom, turf footprint areas
 - Pave pathways and parking lot, construct amenities
