LAW ENFORCEMENT STRANGULATION ADVISEMENT TO VICTIM After a strangulation assault, you can experience internal injuries with a delayed onset of symptoms, usually within 72 hours. These internal injuries can be serious or fatal. Stay with someone you trust for the first 24 hours and have them monitor your signs and symptoms. Seek medical attention or call 911 if you have any of the following symptoms: difficulty breathing, trouble swallowing, swelling to your neck, pain to your throat, hoarseness or voice changes, blurred vision, continuous or severe headaches, seizures, vomiting or persistent cough. The cost of your medical care may be covered by your state's victim compensation fund. An advocate can give you more information. "As a law enforcement officer, I have a duty to warn you that strangulation is serious and can cause internal injuries, brain damage and/or delayed health consequences such as strokes, thyroid issues, miscarriage and/or death. Research shows that if you are

strangled even one time, you are 750% more likely to be killed by your partner. I strongly encourage you to seek immediate medical attention at an emergency department and ask for support from an advocate." **SIGNS SYMPTOMS** YOUR SIGNS
