Initial Response

On May 10, 2006 at approximately 0840 hours, I was in the Detective Bureau at Martinez PD, when I heard Corporal Carter's voice on the overhead intercom that picks up radio traffic. Corporal Carter said that someone had pointed a gun at him and he requested Code 3 cover. Detective Busciglio and I ran to the rear lot of the police department. Detective Maloney joined us. We put on our vests. Detective Maloney got into the passenger side of my vehicle and we proceeded north on Alhambra Avenue. I told Detective Maloney, Corporal Carter had reported that someone had pointed a gun at him. As we approached Escobar Street, Sergeant Prins directed us to the intersection at Escobar Street and Berrellesa Street. We got out of my assigned vehicle and started diverting traffic. Officer Rounds also arrived at our location. A few seconds later, I heard what sounded like several gunshots from the area of Buckley Street just west of Berrellesa Street. We ran two blocks to the area where we had heard the shots.

As I turned westbound at the corner Buckley Street from Berrellesa Street, I saw
Corporal Carter, Officer VanderMeulen and Officer Madsen on the passenger side of Unit 1233,
a Chevrolet Tahoe. The SUV is painted and marked with distinctive Martinez Police markings.
I noticed that Unit 1233 was parked diagonally in the westbound lane of Buckley Street facing westbound approximately half way between Berrellesa Street and Richardson Street. Corporal Carter, Officer VanderMeulen and Officer Madsen were in positions of cover behind the hood of the vehicle with weapons drawn pointing toward the rear stairs east of 405 Richardson Street.

Corporal Carter broadcast that the suspect had been shot and retreated behind some bushes. He asked that a shield be brought to the SUV. I contacted the officers at the SUV. Sergeant Prins delivered the shield to me. Corporal Carter radioed dispatch to request medical units to respond and stage. Corporal Carter, Officer VanderMeulen, Officer Madsen and I put on ballistic helmets. Using the shield we approached the area where Corporal Carter last saw the suspect. As we approached the rear stairs of 405 Richardson Street, I observed a Hispanic Male wearing black pants and a black t-shirt. I could see a hole in the middle of the t-shirt or

the chest of the suspect. The suspects' eyes were open, fixed and dilated. Corporal Carter asked Officer VanderMeulen to handcuff the suspect. I advised dispatch to send one paramedic team to the scene so confirm the suspect was deceased. I also asked dispatch to invoke the Contra Costa County Officer Involved Shooting Protocol.

I contacted Deputy District Attorney William Clark via my cellular telephone to advise him that we had invoked the Fatal Incident Protocol. He told me that he would notify the FIP team and would be en route.

At approximately 0930 hours, members of the Contra Costa County District Attorney's office started arriving at the scene. At approximately 1000 hours, I briefed the listed investigators in the field. We did a walk through of the crime scene, starting from the area where the decedent was positioned, south on Berrellesa Street and then east on Marina Vista and south on Alhambra Avenue to the position where Corporal CARTER's vehicle was parked on Alhambra Avenue.

A subsequent briefing was held in the Emergency Operations Center located at the Martinez Police Department. Sr. Inspector PAUL MULLIGAN and I were assigned to interview the two officers involved in the shooting, the witness officer, the witness who was contacted by Officer VANDERMEULEN prior to the shooting and Sergeant PRINS, who was the Day Shift Watch Commander. The interviews were recorded on audio tapes and the original tapes were logged into evidence at the Martinez Police Department. The interviews of Witness Officer VANDERMEULEN and Sergeant PRINS were documented by Sr. Inspector MULLIGAN. I documented the interviews of Officer MADSEN and Corporal CARTER.

INTERVIEW OF OFFICER DOUG MADSEN

The interview was conducted in the interview room adjacent to the Detective Bureau. The interview was tape recorded. The tape was later logged into evidence at the Martinez Police Department.

Officer MADSEN said he started his shift at 0700 hours and was assigned to patrol the south sector of Martinez. Officer MADSEN said he has been employed by Martinez Police Department for 21 years and has been a motor officer, a DARE officer, a juvenile detective for 3 ½ years and a patrol officer.

Officer MADSEN told me that he was eating breakfast at Victoria's Café in downtown Martinez when Corporal CARTER broadcast a call for Code 3 cover. Officer MADSEN explained that Corporal CARTER said some guy pointed a gun at him near the corporation yard on Buckley Street. Officer MADSEN indicated that while he was in

route to Corporal CARTER's location, Dispatch said she had just taken a call from a reporting party who said someone came to their car door and confronted him with a gun, saying something like "This is your lucky day" or that he was going to kill him. He said the subject tried to pull the trigger but the gun did not go off.

Officer MADSEN indicated that he got into his patrol vehicle and proceeded to drive westbound on Marina Vista. He said that he first saw Officer VANDERMEULEN's marked Chevrolet Tahoe SUV turn northbound onto Berrellesa Street. He said he saw Corporal CARTER on foot on Marina Vista at Berrellesa Street and then turn north toward the corporation yard. Officer MADSEN said that Corporal CARTER signaled to him by pointing in a northerly direction. He said he made eye contact with Corporal CARTER and proceeded to drive westbound on Marina Vista and then northbound on Berrellesa Street.

Officer MADSEN said that as he proceeded northbound on Berrellesa Street from Marina Vista. He observed Officer VANDERMEULEN's vehicle turn west onto Buckley Street. Officer MADSEN said that Corporal CARTER was almost to the corner of Buckley Street at Berrellesa Street. He said Officer VANDERMEULEN went up Buckley Street out of his view. Officer MADSEN said at that time, Corporal CARTER said, "There he is" or something to the effect that indicated the suspect was up there. Officer MADSEN said that he pulled his vehicle to the bottom of the hill because he heard Corporal CARTER say he wanted to "go in on foot". Officer MADSEN said as he was pulling his vehicle to the bottom of the hill, Officer VANDERMEULEN had backed his vehicle up a bit. He had come out of his vehicle and Corporal CARTER was heading up the hill westbound on foot. Officer MADSEN's recollection was that Officer VANDERMEULEN was by the left rear of his vehicle. Officer MADSEN said he was coming up on foot around his vehicle and he saw a guy dressed all in black, which was the description that was provided. Officer MADSEN said he did not know if it was Officer VANDERMEULEN or Corporal CARTER who yelled at the suspect. He said the

suspect looked at them and then pointed what appeared to be a black gun. He said the suspect "pointed it at us."

In response to a question about the positions of the officers, Officer MADSEN said Corporal CARTER was in the middle of the street, Officer VANDERMEULEN was near the left rear of the SUV and he (Officer MADSEN) was coming up on the SUV. Officer MADSEN said when he got to almost parallel to Corporal CARTER, he could see him out of his peripheral vision. Corporal CARTER was stopped aimed from the shoulder and fired two (2) shots. He thought that Corporal CARTER fired first and then Officer VANDERMEULEN fired two (2) shots. Officer MADSEN indicated that they fired the shots towards the south side of Buckley Street at the base of the gray two story apartment complex on the corner of Buckley and Richardson Streets. He said there was a hedge on the street and the suspect fell behind the hedge. Officer MADSEN said they rallied behind the SUV and waited for more officers and a shield. He said that Corporal CARTER, Officer VANDERMEULEN, him and me got the shield and went up to arrest the suspect. He said when he arrived, the suspect was motionless. Officer VANDERMEULEN handcuffed the suspect and someone called fire and ambulance.

Officer MADSEN said the first time he saw Corporal CARTER on foot; he was on Marina Vista moving westbound towards Berrellesa Street. Officer MADSEN was asked to draw a diagram (2 pages).

- Position #1 is where Officer MADSEN believes he was crossing Alhambra Avenue on Marina Vista.
- Position #2 is where Officer MADSEN observed Corporal CARTER on foot with his rifle.
- Position #3 is where Officer MADSEN observed Officer VANDERMEULEN turning onto Berrellesa Street.
- Position #4 is where Officer MADSEN was when he saw Officer VANDERMEULEN turning the corner onto Buckley Street.

- Position #5 is where Officer MADSEN was when he saw Corporal CARTER turning
 the corner onto Buckley Street. Officer MADSEN said he parked down the hill
 because they were going to do a search for the guy. He said they did not know
 where he was so he was pulling up to park and Corporal CARTER had identified
 him.
- Position #6 is where Officer MADSEN placed the mark when asked where he was when he saw Officer VANDERMEULEN backing up.
- Position #7 is where Officer VANDERMEULEN was when Officer MADSEN first saw him backing up.
- Position #8 is where Officer VANDERMEULEN's vehicle ended up.

Officer MADSEN then placed each officer at the time of the shooting, indicating a "C" for Corporal CARTER, "V" for Officer VANDERMEULEN and an "M" for himself.
"S1" indicates where the suspect was by the sidewalk. Officer MADSEN reiterated that the suspect stopped and looked at them. Someone yelled, "Police. Drop your gun."

Officer MADSEN said he did not remember who said it and it seemed like it was repeated. Officer MADSEN said it was at this time that the suspect brought the gun up and aimed it at them.

At this point, Officer MADSEN added to the drawing because it was out of scale and adjusted the location of the building at the southwest corner of Buckley Street. Officer MADSEN said the suspect was at the end of the apartment complex by the hedges. He said the suspect "pointed it right at us." Officer MADSEN said he heard four (4) shots; "two very loud and two not so loud". Officer MADSEN indicated that Corporal CARTER was east of the SUV when the shooting occurred.

In response to the question of how long after Officer MADSEN saw the suspect turn did he raise his hand up, Officer MADSEN said, "Immediately". In response to the question of how long after he raised his hand up did you hear shots fired", Officer MADSEN said, "Immediately". Officer MADSEN said the suspect fell backwards and

out of sight behind the bushes. He said he heard some groaning but did not know if the suspect was alive.

Officer MADSEN said he was wearing the same uniform during the interview as he had been wearing during the incident. He said the SUV and Corporal CARTER's vehicle were both marked police units. I asked Officer MADSEN if anyone had checked his gun to see if it had been fired and he said, "No." At that time, he handed me his Beretta 96S. I checked the chamber and found one round in the chamber and a completely loaded magazine. I checked two additional magazines from his magazine pouch. Both magazines were loaded to capacity.

I asked Officer MADSEN why he did not shoot at the suspect. He said, "Where I was at, I would have had to shoot behind CARTER and VANDERMEULEN." He said, "If I had a clean shot, I would have taken it because he was leveling the gun at us. There was no doubt in my mind."

With respect to the spacing between the shots, Officer MADSEN said they were very quick. When asked what he did when he saw the guy coming up with the gun, Officer MADSEN indicated that when he saw the guy pull the gun out, he moved quickly to the SUV because he assumed shots were going to coming his way and he wanted to get into a position where he could return fire. Officer MADSEN did not remember who brought the shield up to assist with the rescue. Interview with Officer MADSEN was concluded at 1312 hours.

INTERVIEW OF CORPORAL BRIAN CARTER

On 5/10/06 at 1439 hours, Sr. Inspector PAUL MULLIGAN, Sergeant JON SYLVIA and I interviewed Corporal BRIAN CARTER at the Martinez Police Department. The interview was conducted in the Investigations interview room adjacent to the Detective Bureau. The interview was tape recorded. The tape was later logged into evidence at the Martinez Police Department.

Corporal CARTER had been a Reserve Police Officer at the Martinez

Police Department for 1 ½ years before taking a position as a Police Officer with the City of Benicia, where he spent two years working as a patrol officer. Corporal CARTER has been a full time police officer with the Martinez Police Department for the past six (6) years. He has 9 ½ years of law enforcement experience. Corporal CARTER's primary assignment is Patrol Corporal. He works dayshift, 0700-1900 hours; Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Corporal CARTER explained that the Corporal's primary function is to be the Assistant Watch Commander. He said the Sergeant runs the patrol shift and in his absence, the Corporal assumes Watch Commander duties. When I asked if he had any other duties, Corporal CARTER related that he has been on the SWAT team for the past five (5) years. His primary assignment on SWAT is Breacher and Entry Person. Additionally, he has been a firearms instructor for four (4) years. For the past six (6) months, he has been the department rangemaster. He is also one of the department armorer's, specializing in Glock, Remington and Colt weapons. He explained that an armorers' mission is weapons maintenance and function. has received POST certified training in firearms to include handgun, sub-machine gun and shotgun. He said he has had user level and instructor training in patrol rifle, handgun and shotgun as well. Corporal CARTER said he has been a patrol rifle instructor for the department and during the past three (3) years, he has personally instructed patrol rifle on twelve (12) different range dates. He said he is familiar with the use and operation of the AR-15. When I asked if that was a department issued patrol rifle, he said that it was the same platform with minor variations depending on the assignment.

Corporal CARTER stated that he started his shift at 0700 hours. He was assigned to patrol north of Highway 4. He was in full uniform, driving Martinez Police patrol unit #1241. He said that Unit #1241 is a fully marked police car and equipped with an overhead light bar, blue hood and trunk, white doors on the sides. He said his uniform has patches that say "Martinez Police Department" on both shoulders. He

stated that he had a badge on his left breast and was wearing a duty belt. On the duty belt, he was carrying the Glock 23, 40 caliber handgun. In Patrol unit #1241, he had his SWAT rifle in a bag. He stated that the SWAT rifle is a M4, which is a shortened version of the AR-15. He said that normally, the corporals' vehicle contains an AR-15; however, none of the other corporals are authorized to carry the AR-15. Consequently, Corporal Carter carries his authorized SWAT rifle with him on patrol.

I asked Corporal CARTER if earlier in the day he was involved in an incident. He said he was not on a detail, but had just left Rankin Park. He came down to the stop sign at the corner of Buckley Street and Berrellesa Street. He said he was watching vehicles to see who was out. He was parked "almost to the limit line." He said he could not see the sidewalk to his right, referring to the west sidewalk on Berrellesa Street. He said he was running registration checks on vehicles, when he saw a subject walking northbound on Berrellesa Street on the east sidewalk. He described the subject as a Hispanic male or dark skinned white male, approximately 20 years old, with dark hair, wearing a black tee shirt with white writing on the front, black jeans, unknown shoes. When he saw the subject, his windows rolled up, but could see the subject was yelling at him. He said he could not hear what the subject was yelling, but could see that the subject was looking at him and yelling at him. He stated, "I wasn't sure, so I sat there and watched him for a good 30 seconds or so." Corporal CARTER stated, "I couldn't hear at first what he was saying, then he started pointing at me and extending his hand all the way out and motioning for me to come towards him. Going like this." Corporal CARTER demonstrated the action by extended his arms with his palms facing up, and then moving his arms in an up and down motion. Corporal CARTER said the subject was yelling at him the entire time he was moving his arms. He said he was scanning the area to try to figure out what the subject was doing. He estimated that the subject was 30' - 40' away because he was across the street.

Corporal CARTER said the subject started taking his palms and banging his

knuckles together, similar to someone who would be wearing handcuffs. Corporal CARTER said he "smacked" his palms together. Mr. STERN, Corporal CARTER's counsel, interjected stating that it looked like Corporal CARTER was actually striking his wrists together below his palms. Corporal CARTER agreed. I described Corporal CARTER's actions as the signal one police officer would give another police officer to handcuff someone. Corporal CARTER said, "I've done that too, if you smack your wrists together." I asked Corporal CARTER what he understood the subject's actions to mean. He told me that the subject started making a fist and slapping his wrists together again, like the handcuff motion and then would extend one finger at him, as if he was asking Corporal CARTER to come toward him. At the same time, the subject was yelling at him. I asked Corporal CARTER what he took the subject's actions to mean. He thought the subject was challenging him to come over and arrest him. He said things happened really fast. He estimated that 30 seconds had passed from the time the subject came into Corporal CARTER's view and was waving at him. He said he started to roll down his window because he was going to yell out to the subject and ask him what was going on, or what was wrong. As he began reaching down for his window, he saw the subject's right hand go to his waistband. He said the subject pulled out an object which immediately looked like a gun. Corporal CARTER said, "I recognized it as a gun. He said it had the same shape as a gun. It was "L" shaped, pointed on one end and one end was longer than the other." He said the subject took the gun and extended it directly toward him and the windshield of his patrol vehicle. He said, "I was facing directly toward the subject so when he pulled the gun and pointed it toward the windshield, it was where I was sitting. He said the subject fully extended the gun with his right hand and he felt his life was in danger. At that point, he knew the subject had the drop on him and he was going to shoot. He explained that he was taught in the police academy the first thing you do if you are in the "kill zone" and you are in a vehicle is to get out of the "kill zone". Corporal CARTER said,

"So the first thing I did was I hit the accelerator as hard as I could and accelerated the vehicle as fast as I could, making a right hand turn to go southbound on Berrellesa Street to get out of the kill zone." I asked Corporal CARTER why he went southbound on Berrellesa Street and he said, "Because I was afraid of getting shot." Corporal CARTER said, "When I made the right hand turn onto southbound Berrellesa Street, I kinda ducked down in case the subject was going to shoot." He said he accelerated as fast as he could on Berrellesa Street for about two blocks. At the same time, he got on the radio and tried to contact Dispatch. He said the first time he put his call sign out, he was told to hold traffic unless it was a priority. He said he got back on the radio and said something to the effect of "I believe a subject just pointed a handgun at me in the area of Berrellesa and Buckley." He said it was not that he did not know a handgun was pointed at him, but it was more like "did he really just point a handgun at me?" Corporal Carter said, "What is this guy doing pointing a gun at me this close ... he just walked up to a cop car and pointed his gun at me. I couldn't believe it was happening.... It was all so surreal." Corporal CARTER said he advised Dispatch that the person had just pointed a gun at him. He said he thought he provided a description. He remembered that at the same time Dispatch provided information that they were taking an emergency "911" call, where a subject matching the description he had just given Dispatch had gone up to a driver of a vehicle and pointed a gun at his head and said something like, "prepare to meet your maker" or "its time, you're gonna die" or something similar to that. Corporal CARTER said he did not remember the actual wording, but it was something similar to "prepare to meet your maker".

Corporal CARTER said that his state of mind was that the guy had just pointed a gun at him and he thought the subject was going to shoot him. He said he now knew that just two minutes prior to pointing the gun at him, the subject pointed the gun at some random citizen driving down the street. He said he knew he had to go back and confront the subject, but now he knew the subject had pointed the gun at other people.

Corporal CARTER said, "I'm at the point where I'm thinking we possibly have an active shooter or a person randomly walking down the street with a gun pointing it at people." Corporal CARTER said, "I know he had pointed the gun at two people, including me and so not only was I in fear for my life at that initial point when he pointed the gun at me, I'm in fear for everyone else walking around the neighborhood." He said he ended up driving around the block and turning east on Escobar Street; "basically making a big "U" turn". At the same time, he was putting out as much information as he could over the radio, trying to get other people to help him. Corporal CARTER said, "Obviously, if I knew there was a guy out there with a gun, I didn't want to take him on by myself. I was calling for as many people as I could." Corporal CARTER said he pulled around the block and parked parallel to the construction site for what he believed was the new District Attorney's Office. He said that his rationale was that he did not want to drive back into an ambush position so if he was going to confront the subject, he wanted to do it on his own terms. Therefore, he parked a couple of blocks away.

Corporal CARTER said he knew the subject had a handgun, so he grabbed his rifle, which was in the passenger seat. He said he did not want the odds to be even. He said, "I wanted to make sure that I had the upper hand if it came down to that situation." He said he grabbed his SWAT rifle because it is the firearm that he received the most training and that he is most accurate with. He said he could not remember exactly what he said on the radio, but he thought he was putting out a suspect description, advising responding units that the subject had a handgun and provided a general direction of travel. He said he ran towards the area where he last saw the subject. He believed he went up Buckley Street in front of the city corporation yard and ran up the hill.

He said he did not know exactly where the subject was, but observed two people standing next to the apartment where he was originally parked in the 400 block of Berrellesa Street. He said he could see they were on a cell phone and he asked them

"which way did he go?" He said they pointed up the hill and he started to run up the hill. Corporal CARTER said that at the same time, Officer VANDERMEULEN, who was driving the Tahoe SUV patrol vehicle, started going up the hill. He said there was some other person who happened to be walking in the neighborhood and he saw Officer VANDERMEULEN start to drive up to him. He said as he got further up the crest of the hill, he could see that was not the same person. Corporal CARTER said, "So I called for Officer VANDERMEULEN to come back because I did not want him to drive up on the bad guy." He said, "I put out over the radio, something similar to "Jeff, you need to come back or "64", which is his badge number." He said, "I told him that he needs to back up because he was going to drive up on the person." He said he knew that was where the witnesses pointed when he asked where the subject went. He said Officer VANDERMEULEN began to back up toward him and he was running up the hill to meet him at his driver's door.

Corporal CARTER said that was when he noticed the person wearing all black with a handgun, sudden appeared in his view. He said the subject was "right up the hill, 30 or 40 yards or so." He said that Officer VANDERMEULEN's Tahoe SUV was between him and the suspect, so he was not sure which direction the subject had come from. He said, "Basically, he just appeared all of a sudden, once Officer VANDERMEULEN made the turn as he was backing. He said he could not see up the hill because, at first, Officer VANDERMEULEN's Tahoe SUV was blocking the field of vision up the hill. He said as he made a right turn towards the north curbline as he was backing, that was when he saw the suspect all of a sudden. Corporal CARTER said he yelled something to the suspect, but could not remember what he yelled. He said he thought he said, "Get on the ground." Corporal CARTER said that as he yelled at the subject to get on the ground, the subject was raising a gun in his right hand again. He said it looked like the same object in his right hand that looked like a firearm. He said, "To me, as far as I could tell, he was pointing a gun at me. At that point, I was

in fear for my life, thinking he was going to shoot me." He said, "Since Officer VANDERMEULEN and I were in the same line, he was either pointing the handgun at him or me." He said, "So in order to protect my life and the life of Officer VANDERMEULEN, I fired two rounds center mass on the subject and he fell back." Corporal CARTER said he did not know if he hit the suspect, but the suspect disappeared behind a set of bushes at the rear of 405 Richardson Street. He said there were tall bushes on Buckley Street and he could not see the subject any longer. He said he did not know if he was still in the fight or lying in wait and did not want to approach. He stated that he staged paramedics and called for the watch commander to bring the shield out for an approach. He said the subject might still be capable and called for the shield to have cover for the rescue. He said there was just the street between them and the suspect. Corporal CARTER said the rescue team put on ballistic helmets, got into a diamond formation, which was the basic formation one would advance on an active shooter. Officer VANDERMEULEN, Officer MADSEN, Corporal Carter and I (Sergeant Peterson) made the approach. Corporal CARTER said that we advanced all the way to the suspect.

Corporal CARTER said the suspect was lying on his back with his eyes open in a fixed stare and appeared to be deceased at that point. He said he could not see the gun because it had apparently fallen under the suspect when he fell. He said he instructed Officer VANDERMEULEN to handcuff the subject. He said he backed away and was directed to walk down the hill and contact Sergeant PRINS. He said he made his rifle safe and gave it to Sergeant PRINS. Corporal CARTER stated that Officer ROUNDS transported him back to the Martinez Police Department. He said he did not fire his handgun, no one checked it and his gun belt was in his locker.

After the interview, I checked Corporal CARTER's hand gun and found it to be loaded to capacity and both magazines were also loaded to capacity.

When questioned, Corporal CARTER indicated that he first saw the subject near

the south curbline of Buckley Street. He said the subject was moving towards the sidewalk and from the area where Officer VANDERMEULEN's Tahoe SUV was located. Corporal CARTER said he assumed the subject was coming from Richardson Street, traveling north to south and coming down the hill diagonally, moving towards the sidewalk. He said he had not made it to the bushes.

He stated that the first time the suspect pointed a gun at him during the initial incident, he was standing up normally. He said that the second time, he was walking down the hill in a normal walking stride. He remembered firing two (2) rounds from the semi-automatic position. He said that he fired a controlled pair; meaning he grabbed a sight picture and never lost the sight picture. He said he remembered pressing the trigger twice. Corporal CARTER said there were twenty-eight (28) rounds in his magazine. He said he only loads the gun with 28 rounds because he was not sure if there were 27 in the magazine and one in the chamber or 28 in the magazine and one in the chamber. He said when he shot at the subject, he feared for his life because he had no cover, he was in the street five (5) yards away from the Tahoe SUV. He said he had no doubt the subject was going to shoot him.

I asked Corporal CARTER while he was moving up the hill if he was concerned that Officer VANDERMEULEN was going to back over him in the SUV. He said that he was trying to walk up to the driver's door and saw the subject dressed in black. He said Officer VANDERMEULEN was just backing down the hill to meet with him and was not backing at a rapid speed, so he was not concerned about getting hit by the SUV. He said he thought Officer VANDERMEULEN fired two (2) rounds just after he stopped from the vehicle or the doorframe. He said Officer VANDERMEULEN probably saw the subject coming before he did.

I asked Corporal CARTER if he could see the subject's firearm. Corporal CARTER said the firearm extended above his palm and had all the characteristics of a firearm, including an elongated barrel and fist grip. I asked him if he had any idea

what type of firearm it was and he told me, "Definitely a semi-automatic rectangular shaped, like a Glock." He was unsure who fired first and indicated that he did not hear his rounds go off.

Corporal CARTER told us he did not wear glasses and was not taking any medication at the time of the shooting. Corporal CARTER had no doubt that the subject he first encountered was the same subject they confronted on Buckley Street. He did not know if the subject was wearing anything on his hands. Sergeant SYLVIA asked if he recalled what firing position he was in. Corporal CARTER indicated that he held his M4 in a shoulder position and fired from the point. As for pedestrians in the area, Corporal CARTER said that he knew there were two (2) witnesses and the first person Officer VANDERMEULEN encountered had disappeared from his view.

Corporal CARTER described the witnesses as a male and female. The female had short hair and was wearing a baseball cap. He described them both as being Caucasian, in their late 20s.

Additionally, we asked Corporal CARTER when the subject brought the gun up, was there anything protruding below the subject's hands and he said he did not know. When asked if he could see the barrel hole, Corporal CARTER said they were too far away and he could not see. He did say he had never seen the subject before. We terminated the interview at this point.

Crime Scene Simulation

On Friday, 5/12/06 at 0800 hours, I picked up a brown evidence bag from the Contra Costa County Crime Lab. The bag was marked with Martinez Police Case #06-2143, Item #6. I signed the chain of custody and took possession of the bag.

I returned to the Martinez Police Department and opened the bag. Upon inspection, I saw a black plastic pellet gun that fired plastic pellets. I gave the bag and its contents to Detective BUSCIGLIO. I instructed Detective BUSCIGLIO not to show the item to anyone else.

I subsequently met with Detective MALONEY, Officer ESTANOL, Sr. Inspector MULLIGAN and DDA Bill CLARK. We parked on Berrellesa Street at Buckley Street. We parked the marked Chevy Tahoe approximate to where the vehicle was discovered after the shooting. Based on the statements made by Officer VANDERMEULEN and Corporal CARTER, we made a mark in the roadway in the area proximate to where Corporal CARTER was when they engaged the suspect. Detective BUSCIGLIO was dressed in black BDUs, black tee-shirt and was wearing black gloves. He parked at the intersection of Richardson Street and Buckley Street. He was instructed to stand near the stairs to the rear of 405 Richardson Street. This is the area where the suspect was found after the shooting.

Based on the statements made by the officers, Detective BUSCIGLIO was instructed to move from the area near the stairs out in the street and raise the handgun with his right hand towards the Chevy Tahoe SUV and towards the area where Corporal CARTER was standing. We had Detective BUSCIGLIO perform this simulation several times with one hand and with two hands on the gun.

During the first simulation, I sat in the driver's seat of the SUV. When Detective BUSCIGLIO emerged from the bushes and raised the pellet gun to shoulder height with his right hand, it appeared to me that the item in his hand was a firearm. I asked Sr. Inspector MULLIGAN, who was standing where Corporal CARTER was estimated to be standing when the shooting occurred, and he said that he believed that Detective BUSCIGLIO was raising a firearm and could not tell that the item was a plastic pellet gun. DDA CLARK and Detective MALONEY concurred. Sr. Inspector MULLIGAN and I switched places and he sat in the SUV while I stood where he had been. Detective BUSCIGLIO repeated the simulation several times. Each time Detective BUSCIGLIO raised the plastic pellet gun, it appeared to me to be a firearm. Based on my training and experience, I would have engaged the suspect.

I spoke with Sr. Inspector MULLIGAN after the simulation and he indicated that

On 051006 at approximately 0840 hours, I was in the detective bureau when I noticed Sgt Peterson and Det Busciglio running from the bureau towards the rear of the building. I followed them into the rear lot of the Martinez Police Department where Sgt Peterson told me that someone had pointed a gun at Cpl Carter. We pulled police raid vests from the trunks of our vehicles and drove to the scene. I rode in Sgt Peterson's vehicle. Upon our arrival in the area, Sgt Prins requested that we lock down the intersection at Escobar St and Berrellesa St as part of an effort to secure the perimeter for a search. Almost immediately after we exited Sgt Peterson's vehicle, I heard several gunshots from the area of Buckley St just west of Berrellesa St. We ran to the area where we had heard the shooting. Ofc Herb Rounds arrived in the area at approximately the same time we did and was also running toward the sound of the shoots.

As I turned westbound on Buckley St from Berrellesa St. I saw Cpl Carter, Ofc Vandermeulen and Ofc Madsen in tactical positions on the passenger side of Unit 1233, a 2002 Chevrolet Tahoe that is painted and marked with distinctive Martinez Police markings. Unit 1233 was parked diagonally in the westbound lane of Buckley St facing westbound approximately half way between Berrellesa St and Richardson St. Cpl Carter, Ofc Vandermeulen and Ofc Madsen were in positions of cover behind the hood of the vehicle with weapons drawn pointing toward a staircase area to the east of 405 Richardson St. There were large bushes obscuring the bottom area of the stairs.

Cpl Carter said that the suspect had been shot and went down behind the bushes. However, because they couldn't see the bottom area of the stairs, they were unable to tell whether or not he was still a threat. Cpl Carter radioed dispatch to request medical units to respond and stage. I retrieved helmets from the rear of Unit 1233, and another officer brought the shield up from another vehicle. Sgt Peterson, Cpl Carter, Ofc Vandermeulen, and Ofc Madsen approached the area of the suspect, using the shield and helmets for protection. I remained at the vehicle with Ofc Rounds and provided additional cover. After approaching the suspect, Sgt Peterson motioned me that they were "Code 4."

After the scene was declared secure, I took several photographs of the scene and the suspect. In addition, Det Busciglio located a citizen who had apparently been hit in the chest with ricochet fragments. I took photographs of him and of his wound. I also initiated a crime scene control log.

AMR Paramedic Unit 159 and Consolidated Fire Engine 14 arrived on scene at approximately 0850
hours. The following personnel were on Paramedic Unit 159:

During early morning hours in downtown Martinez, the suspect points a gun at the victim who is sitting alone in his car at a construction job site. The suspect says: "This is the last day of your life." He pulls the trigger two times never discharging a round from the gun. The suspect runs away from the scene and confronts a uniformed Police Officer who is walking in the area. The suspect points the gun at the Police Officer, then runs away into a residential neighborhood. The Police Officer calls for assistance and later confronts the armed suspect behind multi-unit residential building. The suspect points a gun at Police, and is subsequently shot and killed.

On Wednesday, May 10th 2006, at approximately 0915 hours, I was contacted at my desk and by Lieutenant JACKSON and advised that Martinez Police had shot and killed a suspect near downtown Martinez. Lt. JACKSON asked me to respond to the crime scene along with several other Investigators from our office. I arrived at approximately 0930 hours and contacted Sergeant Gary PETERSON. We viewed the crime scene then returned to Martinez Police station for a briefing and assignments. I was teamed with Detective Lisa MALONEY and assigned to interview the original victim, AMR, and Fire personnel. All interviews were digitally and audio-recorded by myself and Detective MALONEY.

(The interview was conducted at his residence in Elk Grove and Victim began at 1340 hours and ended at 1424 hours) is a Special Inspector hired by the County to inspect welds on a County building that is currently under construction on Alhambra Ave. in Martinez. arrived at work at about 7am and parked his car in a dirt parking lot on the 400 block of Escobar St. near the job site trailer which faces Alhambra Ave, across from the new County building. Narrative:

This report will document my participation in the protocol investigation into the death of Robert SILVA who was shot and killed by Martinez Police Department officers on 5-10-2006. It will include the interview of who witnessed the shooting, and the interviews of MPD personnel, Officers Doug MADSEN and Jeff VANDERMEULEN, Corporal Brian CARTER, and Sergeant Evert PRINS.

On 5-10-2006 at approximately 0915 hours, I received a call from Chief of Inspectors Gene GREENWALD requesting that I respond to the vicinity of the Martinez Corporation Yard to assist in the investigation of an officer-involved shooting.

Sergeant PETERSON, MPD Sergeant Jon SYLVIA, and I then interviewed Officer Jeff VANDERMEULEN. I was the primary interviewer. In addition, attorney Harry STERN of the law firm of Rains, Lucia and Wilkinson, was present during the interview as the officer's legal representative.

Officer VANDERMEULEN has been a sworn member of the MPD for 24 years and has worked in almost every assignment within the department (e.g., field training officer, armorer, range-master, patrol officer, investigator, and motor officer). Prior to employment with the Martinez Police Department, the officer had been a Clayton police officer for three years, and was a reserve police officer for the Clayton Police Department for one year. The officer said that he never served in the military.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that on the day of this incident, he was working the 7am-7pm shift as a uniformed patrol officer. He was driving MPD unit # 1233 (a marked MPD SUV). Officer VANDERMEULEN said he carried his duty handgun (a Beretta Model 96, .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol) and added that he had one magazine in the gun, and carried three magazines on his gunbelt. In addition, he said there was a 12 gauge police shotgun in the patrol vehicle, however, the officer said the shotgun was not utilized in this incident.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that just prior to this incident, he was having coffee with Sergeant PRINS and Officer MADSEN at Victoria's Café. At that time, they heard a police

radio broadcast from Corporal CARTER who said he thought someone had just pointed a gun at him at Berrellesa and Alhambra.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said he immediately responded. While en-route, the MPD dispatcher broadcast that she had received a 911 call reporting that someone had called the MPD reporting a similar type of experience (i.e., a suspect had pointed a gun at the reporting party). Officer VANDERMEULEN said he arrived at the scene within 20-30 seconds.

Upon arrival, Officer VANDERMEULEN looked for Corporal CARTER and saw him on foot on Marina Vista at Alhambra. At the time, Corporal CARTER was carrying an AR-15 M4 assault rifle and was walking westbound toward Berrellesa. Corporal CARTER told Officer VANDERMEULEN that "some guy dressed in black had just pointed a gun" at him, and Corporal CARTER motioned toward Berrellesa and Buckley. Officer VANDERMEULEN stayed in his vehicle and drove in that direction while Corporal CARTER walked behind Officer VANDERMEULEN's patrol vehicle.

Corporal CARTER told him that the subject (was not involved.	

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he resumed looking for the suspect and Corporal CARTER asked Officer VANDERMEULEN to join him down the hill so they did not get too far apart. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he then began backing down Buckley Street toward Corporal CARTER at which time the suspect SILVA suddenly ran around the corner at "full speed". Officer VANDERMEULEN said that SILVA ran southbound from Richardson onto Buckley and ran on a diagonal in the officer's direction.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that SILVA had his hands together in a two handed grip or stance like he was going to "shoot on the move." Officer VANDERMEULEN said that SILVA's behavior was "bizarre," and it seemed to Officer VANDERMEULEN that SILVA was running at the officer like he was "ready to engage." At the same time, Corporal CARTER said "that's him." Officer VANDEMEULEN could not recall if Corporal CARTER said this on the police radio or if the corporal had yelled this to him.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he was afraid that the suspect would engage him when the officer was still in his patrol car, so Officer VANDERMEULEN opened the front door to his patrol vehicle kicking it open with his foot and at the same time drawing his handgun.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that while SILVA was running, SILVA was using a "Weaver" type of stance, and the officer said that SILVA appeared to be "tracking him" with the weapon. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he yelled at SILVA to "drop your gun, drop your gun," however, SILVA did not.

SILVA then ran across the front of the patrol vehicle and ran to the bushes adjacent to 405 Richardson Street. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that once SILVA reached the bushes SILVA started popping in and out of the bushes and pointed the weapon at the officer using a "Weaver" type of grip.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he then fired two rounds at the suspect. Both rounds were fired from inside the officer's patrol vehicle. Corporal CARTER also fired. Officer VANDERMEULEN was not sure who fired the first rounds at the suspect (he or Corporal CARTER). Officer VANDERMEULEN said when the shots were fired, Corporal CARTER was on foot behind and to the left of Officer VANDERMEULEN's vehicle.

After the shooting, Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he got out of his patrol vehicle and waited for Sergeant PETERSON with the shield. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that at point, he along with Sergeant PETERSON, Officer MADSEN, and Corporal CARTER approached the downed suspect using the ballistic shield for cover.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he then handcuffed SILVA. I asked if anyone had administered first aid, and the officer said that no-one had as SILVA was dead as his eyes were completely dilated.

When asked to describe the time frame from the time he first challenged SILVA to the time he fired the shots, Officer VANDERMEULEN said it was "seconds." I also asked Officer VANDERMEULEN if he was fearful for his safety and the safety of his fellow officers due to the suspect's actions, and Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he was.

I asked the officer if he wore eyeglasses or contacts and Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he wears contacts which he was wearing at the time of the incident. In response to my questions, Officer VANDERMEULEN said that the only medication he had taken prior to this incident was

blood pressure medicine, and he said that he had not had any alcoholic beverages during the two days before this encounter.

Sergeant PETERSON then sought clarification on a couple of points from the officer. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that when he was backing down Buckley Street, SILVA suddenly appeared and pointed the gun at Officer VANDERMEULEN. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that because it appeared that the suspect was going to "engage" him, he turned the SUV to give himself a better tactical vantage point.

I asked Officer VANDERMEULEN what type of weapon the suspect had, and the officer said that it was a handgun, but, he could not recall the color. Attorney STERN then asked Officer VANDERMEULEN if the SUV was in park when the shots were fired, and Officer VANDERMEULEN confirmed that it was.

Sergeant SYLVIA then discussed Officer VANDERMEULEN's previous experience as a rangemaster, and the fact that the stances and hand motions utilized by SILVA during this incident are of the type generally used when firing weapons. Officer VANDERMEULEN confirmed that they were.

At that point I asked Officer VANDERMEULEN to prepare a diagram of the scene depicting the positions of the parties during pertinent times. The diagram is Evidence Item # PM-4. While drawing the diagram, Officer VANDERMEULEN further elaborated on the suspect's movements and motions at the time of this incident.

Officer VANDERMEULEN reiterated that the suspect came around the corner at a full run and ran diagonally to the bushes. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that as the suspect was running diagonally, the suspect did so in a "side gait" and continued to face the officer as he did.

At that point in the interview, I asked Officer VANDERMEULEN if there was anything that we had not discussed which he believed was important. Officer VANDERMEULEN reiterated that SILVA behavior was very purposeful and determined and that it looked like SILVA wanted a confrontation. The officer also mentioned that the officer's anxiety level was raised due to the fact that the SILVA was not at all deterred by fact the officer was pointing his weapon at him. When asked, Officer VANDERMEULEN said that the suspect never said anything to him at all.

In addition, Officer VANDERMEULEN reiterated that the suspect kept popping up and down and was "ground-hogging." He also said that at times the suspect had the gun in a "low-ready" position.

I then asked Officer VANDERMEULEN for a description of the suspect, and he described him as a white male with dark clothing, dark tee-shirt and black jeans, very slender. I also asked if the suspect had anything on his hands (e.g., gloves) and Officer VANDERMEULEN said that there was nothing on SILVA's hands.

Sergeant SYLVIA then asked Officer VANDERMEULEN what Corporal CARTER had told him at the start of this incident. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that Corporal CARTER told him "I think somebody just pointed a gun at me." Sergeant SYLVIA also asked Officer VANDERMEULEN to describe the gun and Officer VANDERMEULEN said it looked like an automatic.

The interview ended at 1435 hours.

Interview of MPD Sergeant Evert PRINS

Sergeant PETERSON and I interviewed Sergeant Evert PRINS, who was the on-duty patrol supervisor who responded to this incident. I was the primary interviewer. Sergeant PRINS said that he has been on the MPD for 22 years, and had been on duty since 0600 hours on the date of this incident.

Sergeant PRINS said that he first became involved in this incident when Corporal CARTER broadcast on his police radio a request for "Code 3" cover because he had been the victim of a brandishing. The sergeant responded to the scene from Victoria's Café, arriving within a minute. Upon arrival in the area of Alhambra and Marina Vista, the sergeant said he saw Corporal CARTER on foot carrying his patrol rifle. Sergeant PRINS said they began to set up a perimeter looking for the suspect who was described as being dressed all in black.

As they were setting up the perimeter, the sergeant said he heard 4-5 shots, at which point Sergeant PRINS said that he (PRINS) broadcast an Officer Needs Assistance call. When he heard the shots, Sergeant PRINS said he was at Marina Vista and Alhambra which is about two blocks from the scene. Sergeant PRINS said he immediately responded to the scene in patrol vehicle # 1236 which had the ballistic shield in the trunk. Sergeant PRINS said that he assumed a position of cover while four officers used the ballistic shield and approached the suspect. After

determining that the suspect no longer posed a threat, Sergeant PRINS said that Sergeant PETERSON immediately invoked the protocol. Sergeant PRINS then ensured that the scene was secure.

At that point the first interview with Sergeant PRINS was concluded.

Sergeant PETERSON and I subsequently learned that Sergeant PRINS had taken "Public Safety" Statements (per New York v. Quarles) from Corporal CARTER and Officer VANDERMEULEN immediately after this incident. Sergeant PETERSON and I briefly interviewed Sergeant PRINS about the conversations he had had with Corporal CARTER and Officer VANDERMEULEN after the shooting.

Sergeant PRINS said that Corporal CARTER told the sergeant that he thought he fired two rounds at the suspect. Sergeant PRINS then spoke to Officer VANDERMEULEN who described firing two shots at the suspect.

Sergeant PRINS also mentioned that while at the scene, he had taken the duty handgun from Officer VANDERMEULEN and the assault rifle from Corporal CARTER. At that point the second interview was concluded.

Autopsy of Robert SILVA

On 5-11-2006 Doctor Brian PETERSON performed the forensic autopsy on Robert SILVA. I attended along with Sergeant Gary PETERSON, Deputy District Attorney Bill CLARK, Deputy District Attorney Robert HOLE, and members of the Sheriff's Office forensics unit. The results of the autopsy will be documented in Doctor PETERSON's report.

Reenactment

On 5-12-2006, I went to the scene and met with Deputy District Attorney Bill CLARK, Sergeant PETERSON and other members of the Martinez Police Department. At 0840 hours (i.e., the same time as the shooting occurred on 5-10-2006), MPD Detective Kevin BUSCIGLIO wore a black shirt and did a limited reenactment of the suspect's movements as described by the officers involved in the incident. In addition, the MPD SUV which Officer VANDERMEULEN was driving on the date of the shooting was parked in the same position as it had been on the date of the incident.

On May 10th, 2006 at approximately 0900 hours, I was notified of this protocol investigation by Lieutenant of Inspectors Daryl Jackson. Lieutenant Jackson told me that at approximately 0840 hours this date, two Officers with the Martinez Police Department were confronted by an unidentified armed suspect while investigating a man with a gun call in the 400 of Buckley Avenue. Lieutenant Jackson told me that as a result of this confrontation, shots were fired by the two Martinez Police Officers, and the unidentified male suspect was pronounced deceased at the scene. Lieutenant Jackson told me protocol had been enacted, and requested I respond to the location of occurrence and assist with this investigation.

When I arrived to the scene, I noted it had been secured by several uniformed Martinez Police Officers. I approached one of these Officers, and identified myself as being with the District Attorneys Office. I then entered the scene, where I met with DDA William Clark, and Senior Inspectors Paul Mulligan and Paul Peterson who was the "on-call" Senior Inspector representing our agency. For this reason, Senior Inspector Peterson was assigned as the lead investigator for this protocol.

After speaking briefly with Senior Inspector Peterson, I was met by Commander Tom Simonetti of the Martinez Police Department. I identified myself to Commander Simonetti, at which time he provided me with a brief synopsis of what had occurred. Commander Simonetti explained to me that two Martinez Police Officers he identified as Officer Jeff Vandermuelen and Corporal Brian Carter were involved in a shooting following a confrontation in the 400 block of Buckley Avenue. Commander Simonetti told me that neither Officer was injured as a result of this confrontation, however an unidentified white male suspect in his mid-twenties was pronounced deceased at the scene. Commander Simonetti told me that this confrontation occurred as both Officer Vandermuelen and Corporal Brian Carter were dispatched to this location to investigate a report of a man with a gun. Commander Simonetti told me that this incident occurred sometime after 8:30am this morning.

After speaking with Commander Simonetti, DDA Clark and myself were told that the deceased suspect was still on scene, and was located a half block west of our location behind an apartment complex located at 405 Buckley Avenue. DDA Clark and myself then walked to this location to look at the scene, and the condition of the deceased suspect.

When we arrived to this location, the suspect was covered with a yellow tarp, and was laying on the pedestrian walkway behind 405 Buckley Avenue which is a multi-unit dwelling for disabled adults. A Martinez Police Officer remained with the suspect at this location, and I asked this Officer if he recognized the suspect from prior contacts, and he told me "no". Most of the Martinez Police Officers at the scene during this time also indicated they did not recognize the responsible which is unusual for this location as it has a high concentration of transients who frequent the area. There are several multi-unit dwelling houses within this immediate vicinity which house disabled adults which is the reason for the more than normal transient population.

After speaking with the Martinez Officer on scene, I pulled the yellow tarp from the suspect(s) face to see if I recognized him, and to view his condition. I noted that the suspect was a white male appearing to be in his late twenties with a very slight build almost as if he was malnourished. The suspect was wearing all black clothing, including black cloth gloves on both hands. His black t-shirt had a silk screen photograph of "Che Guevara" on the front of the shirt,

Following this identification, DDA Hole also requested we conduct the death notification with next of kin in addition to obtaining some background history on the suspect with family members and friends.



confronted an armed subject and subsequently shot and killed him. I was instructed to respond to the area of the shooting, Berrellesa St and Buckley St., and assist in the investigation. I arrived at the location at 0930 hours.

After observing the crime scene, the investigators went to the Martinez Police Department for a briefing and investigative assignments. I was teamed with Officer Estanol of the Martinez Police Department. We were assigned to interview residents near the location of the shooting.

All of the interviews were audio tape recorded by Officer Estanol and myself. Eleven of the interviews took place at the witness' homes, except for this interview took place at her place of employment.

Our neighborhood canvas resulted in contact with 11 individuals. Most of these individuals heard what they thought sounded like firecrackers, or gunshots, but they did not see anything unusual.

The twelfth interview, took place at the Martinez Police Department. It is a Martinez city employee who had encountered the suspect in downtown Martinez, approximately 15 minutes prior to the shooting.

A synopsis of all the interviews will be included in Officer Estanol's report.

No further action was taken by this investigator.

REPORT OF FIELD SERVICES:

On 5/10/06, at approximately 0930 hours I was informed by Senior Clerk Patricia Olmstead of an officer involved shooting in Martinez. Sergeant Simonette requested our assistance to document the scene and collect evidence.

Lab Aide Rosary Marcelo and I gathered our equipment and responded to the scene. The scene is located on Buckley Street between Berrellesa and Richardson in Martinez. The scene was secured by Officers, crime scene tape, and patrol cars.

Various officers and DA investigators briefed us on what had occurred:

At roughly 0845 hours Richard Silva approached a man in a car in the parking lot by the corner of Alhambra and Escobar. Silva knocked on the window and the man opened the door. Silva pointed a gun at the man and said "Today is your last day on earth". Silva then pulled the trigger twice and the man ducked down to avoid the gun. The man said the gun did not go off and Silva ran away. The man said the gun looked like a Tec-9 or something similar. The man said he heard the gun click twice but it did not fire. The man yelled to others in the construction crew office to call 911. Martinez police responded and found Silva on Buckley. One officer was on foot the other driving a SUV. As the officers approached Silva he pointed a firearm at them and they fired at him. They took cover behind the SUV and waited for a shield to approach Silva who had disappeared behind a hedge. They approached and found Silva dead behind the hedge.

We did a quick survey of the scene. Three fired cartridge cases were observed in the north gutter east of the SUV. Three cartridge cases were located in the SUV and another cartridge case under the SUV. Suspected bullet impacts were observed on the stucco wall of the house on the southeast corner of Buckley and Richardson. Silva's body was present on his back below the rear staircase next to the wall. Criminalist Alex Taflya and Crime Scene Investigator Carolyn Crain arrived to assist. Taflya began taking overall photographs. I rendered both officers' guns safe and packaged them for transport. I received the guns from the Watch Commander's car at the scene. All four of us searched Buckley Street for bullets and bullet fragments. A fired bullet was located in the intersection of Buckley and Richardson. A rusty ball bearing was also located and collected, but is most likely not involved. No other bullets or fragments were recovered.

The Coroner arrived and Silva's body was examined. He has a bullet entrance wound to the center of his chest. He was rolled over and an exit wound and a grazing wound were observed on his back. We assisted the coroner's in placing Silva in a body bag and he was removed from the scene to the Morgue.

We used Lead Check Swabs to test the impacts to the wall. The Lead Check Swabs tested positive with known lead and negative on control areas on the wall. Several of the impacts tested positive. A couple suspected areas tested negative as did two of the impact sites. The two impacts that tested negative did so due to the amount of material ejected from the impact site after being struck (transferred lead ejected out with stucco). We marked evidence with numbered cones and took photographs. We then marked evidence locations and bullet impacts on the wall with blue paint. Crain and Marcelo then departed the scene to meet with a helicopter from East Bay Regional Parks. The helicopter took them up and Crain took aerial photographs of the scene. Taflya and I collected the evidence and took measurements of the scene. Rough sketches of the scene and wall were prepared.

Both officers were brought back to the scene and told me from where they fired shots. I noted where they said they were with where evidence was located. The evidence corresponds very closely to where the officers said they were.

With nothing further we departed the scene.

The Beretta pistol had one cartridge in the chamber and seven in the magazine (total of 8 out of a possible 12 rounds). Standard procedure at Martinez PD is to top off magazine after charging pistol for 12 rounds. With the four fired rounds 12 rounds accounted for.

The Colt carbine had one cartridge in the chamber and 23 in the magazine (total of 24 out of a possible 31). Standard procedure at Martinez PD is to down load magazine two rounds and leave chamber empty until needed for 28 rounds. With the three fired rounds 27 rounds accounted for. Magazine has good, tight springs so 27 rounds is possible.

EXAMINATION:

The pellet gun was transferred to Lead Fingerprint Examiner Cindy Hull for latent print processing on 5/10/06. She returned the pellet gun to me on 5/11/06. The pellet gun was examined. It was plugged with dirt. The dirt was cleared from the barrel. I examined the pellet gun with a borescope and discovered that one of the pellets was stuck in the feed area and that pellets were not feeding into the barrel so they would fire. The pellet was

dislodged and the pellet gun worked normally after that. The pellet gun is not very powerful and pellets only travel about 10 feet once fired from the gun.

Both the Beretta pistol and the Colt carbine were test-fired at the Sheriff's Range to determine approximate ejection patterns when held normally with two handed grips. Both eject cartridge cases slightly back and to the right. Ejection patterns are consistent with what was observed at the scene and with what officers told us.

DISPOSITION:

On 5/11/06, the pellet gun was placed into Escobar Return for pickup.

On 5/15/06, the officer's guns were placed into Escobar Return for pickup.

On 5/19/06, the other evidence was placed into the Evidence Room pending additional analysis. The images were burned to CD's and a copy was placed into the Photograph File and a copy was sent to Martinez Police Department Investigations.

REPORT OF FIELD SERVICES:

On May 11, 2006, I was requested by Supervising Criminalist P. Holes to document the autopsy of Robert Silva who had reportedly been shot while brandishing a weapon at police on Buckley Street in Martinez. Refer to Laboratory report 06-5481-1 for details regarding the scene processing. Laboratory Aide R. Marcelo was assigned to assist. We arrived at the Coroner's Office at approximately 7:50 AM. The autopsy was performed by Dr. B. Peterson and Pathologist Assistant S. Jagoda.

According to Martinez P.D. Sergeant T. Simonette, Silva had a handgun, approached a construction worker who was seated in his vehicle, and threatened to shoot him. Silva reportedly fled on foot from this area and confronted a Martinez P.D. Officer who saw the weapon and requested backup. Silva reportedly headed down Buckley Street and brandished his weapon while running across the street. At that time, Martinez P.D. Officers fired at Silva and he was struck several times. He was found lying at the bottom of a staircase behind a bush.

Silva, a White male adult with short brown hair, green eyes, no facial hair and intact teeth, was lying on his ck in a blue body bag. His hands were in front of his body with handcuffs around both wrists and fingerprint powder on the palms and fingers. A toe tag was attached to his left great toe. He was wearing: a black "Ernesto Che Guevara" t-shirt, a white t-shirt, black "NYC" jeans with a black belt, white "Ralph Lauren" gym shoes and white ankle socks, and blue patterned boxer shorts. A rosary without a cross was around his neck. His prescription glasses were bent and lying in the body bag along with a pair of black gloves. The gloves were removed at the scene in order to obtain fingerprints for identification. Two monochrome tattoos were visible on his upper arms: "USMC" and an eagle on his right and "Silva" and a dragon on his left. ECG patches were attached to his left and right forearm.

Three apparent bullet wounds were visible on the body. A circular shaped apparent bullet entry wound, labeled hole "A", was on the upper chest near the midline. An irregular shaped apparent bullet exit wound, labeled "B", was on the lower right side of the back. An apparent graze type wound, labeled "C", was located on the upper back near the left shoulder area. The trajectory for wounds A and B appeared to be from front to back, left to right and downward. See Coroner's Report 06-1111 for further details regarding the wounds and trajectory. No bullets or fragments were recovered.

The overall appearance of the body and close-up details of the injuries were recorded with a series of photographs. Head and pubic hair standards, as well as nail clippings were collected. A liquid blood standard

Narrative:

During early morning hours in downtown Martinez, the suspect points a gun at the victim who is sitting alone in his car at a construction job site. The suspect says: "This is the last day of your life." He pulls the trigger two times never discharging a round from the gun. The suspect runs away from the scene and confronts a uniformed Police Officer who is walking in the area. The suspect points the gun at the Police Officer, then runs away into a residential neighborhood. The Police Officer calls for assistance and later confronts the armed suspect behind multi-unit residential building. The suspect points a gun at Police, and is subsequently shot and killed.

On Wednesday, May 10th 2006, at approximately 0915 hours, I was contacted at my desk and by Lieutenant JACKSON and advised that Martinez Police had shot and killed a suspect near downtown Martinez. Lt. JACKSON asked me to respond to the crime scene along with several other Investigators from our office. I arrived at approximately 0930 hours and contacted Sergeant Gary PETERSON. We viewed the crime scene then returned to Martinez Police station for a briefing and assignments. I was teamed with Detective Lisa MALONEY and assigned to interview the original victim, AMR, and Fire personnel. All interviews were digitally and audio-recorded by myself and Detective MALONEY.

Victim began at 1340 hours and ended at 1424 hours)

It is a Special Inspector hired by the County to inspect welds on a County building that is currently under construction on Alhambra Ave. in Martinez. The arrived at work at about 7am and parked his car in a dirt parking lot on the 400 block of Escobar St. near the job site trailer which faces Alhambra Ave, across from the new County building. He walked over to the job site and met with one of the welders who were performing work on a stairwell. After about ten minutes, he left the site and walked downtown to the ATM machine at Bank of America on Main St., and got some money. He then headed to Victoria's for breakfast where he dined alone and was one of about ten people in the restaurant. After breakfast, he leisurely made his way back to the job site, window browsing along the way. Spent about ten minutes with the welder, then returned to his car to organize some paperwork. He turned the ignition key on and noted that it was 8:30 while he was listening to the radio. He was sitting in his car alone for about ten minutes when he heard a tap on his window and looked over his left shoulder.

While still looking at the suspect, sat back in his seat and tried to make himself as small as possible to avoid being shot. At that point, the suspect pulled the trigger again and heard another "clunk." Again, the gun did not discharge. It looked at the suspect who now faked like he was going to run right towards Alhambra Ave., but instead ran left (west) on Escobar St. towards Berrellesa St. Got out of his car and watched the suspect run around the corner onto northbound Berryelessa St. and disappear. Said the suspect ran very uncoordinated as he fled the scene. After the suspect pulled the trigger the first time, described his facial expression as serious but very calm. After the second time, said his face looked surprised as if he expected the gun to discharge.
described the suspect as a young White or Hispanic male, 15 to 20 years old, slender, dark brown hair neatly cut, no facial hair, or jewelry. The suspect was wearing a black tee shirt with some kind of an image of a person on the shirt. The suspect did not have an accent. described the gun as black and shiny but not a revolver. who is familiar with weapons because of his military background, did not recognize this gun as something he had ever seen before and even mentioned that it could have been a toy gun, however, it did not have toy gun characteristics such as an orange tip. The overall impression was that the gun was a Tech 9. In retrospect, said the suspect appeared to be inexperienced because he twisted the gun to pull the trigger as if the safety was on and used just his right hand to shoot the gun, however, based on his calm assured voice, and serious expression, said he was scared for his life and thought he was going to die. As far as was concerned, the gun was real. The suspect was about four to five feet away from when he pulled the trigger.
immediately went to the job site trailer and contacted the job supervisor who called 911 to report the incident. Eventually talked directly to the 911 dispatcher. After calling 911, went outside and stood on the porch of the trailer which is located across from the job site at 550 Alhambra Ave. heard several gunshots from two different weapons. Narrative:

This report will document my participation in the protocol investigation into the death of Robert SILVA who was shot and killed by Martinez Police Department officers on 5-10-2006. It will include the interview of who witnessed the shooting, and the interviews of MPD personnel, Officers Doug MADSEN and Jeff VANDERMEULEN, Corporal Brian CARTER, and Sergeant Evert PRINS.

On 5-10-2006 at approximately 0915 hours, I received a call from Chief of Inspectors Gene GREENWALD requesting that I respond to the vicinity of the Martinez Corporation Yard to assist in the investigation of an officer-involved shooting.

I responded to the area of Buckley Street and Richardson Street where I met with MPD personnel. At the time, the scene was secured and the body of the deceased, Robert SILVA, was still on site.

After viewing the scene, I went to the police station where I attended a briefing. During the briefing, I was assigned to an investigative team with MPD Sergeant Gary PETERSON. Our

Interview of Officer Doug MADSEN

After interviewing Sergeant PETERSON and I interviewed Officer Doug MADSEN who had witnessed the shooting. Sergeant PETERSON was the primary interviewer. For details as to the interview, please refer to Sergeant PETERSON's report.

Interview of Officer Jeff VANDERMEULEN

Sergeant PETERSON, MPD Sergeant Jon SYLVIA, and I then interviewed Officer Jeff VANDERMEULEN. I was the primary interviewer. In addition, attorney Harry STERN of the law firm of Rains, Lucia and Wilkinson, was present during the interview as the officer's legal representative.

Officer VANDERMEULEN has been a sworn member of the MPD for 24 years and has worked in almost every assignment within the department (e.g., field training officer, armorer, range-master, patrol officer, investigator, and motor officer). Prior to employment with the Martinez Police Department, the officer had been a Clayton police officer for three years, and was a reserve police officer for the Clayton Police Department for one year. The officer said that he never served in the military.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that on the day of this incident, he was working the 7am-7pm shift as a uniformed patrol officer. He was driving MPD unit # 1233 (a marked MPD SUV). Officer VANDERMEULEN said he carried his duty handgun (a Beretta Model 96, .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol) and added that he had one magazine in the gun, and carried three magazines on his gunbelt. In addition, he said there was a 12 gauge police shotgun in the patrol vehicle, however, the officer said the shotgun was not utilized in this incident.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that just prior to this incident, he was having coffee with Sergeant PRINS and Officer MADSEN at Victoria's Café. At that time, they heard a police

radio broadcast from Corporal CARTER who said he thought someone had just pointed a gun at him at Berrellesa and Alhambra.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said he immediately responded. While en-route, the MPD dispatcher broadcast that she had received a 911 call reporting that someone had called the MPD reporting a similar type of experience (i.e., a suspect had pointed a gun at the reporting party). Officer VANDERMEULEN said he arrived at the scene within 20-30 seconds.

Upon arrival, Officer VANDERMEULEN looked for Corporal CARTER and saw him on foot on Marina Vista at Alhambra. At the time, Corporal CARTER was carrying an AR-15 M4 assault rifle and was walking westbound toward Berrellesa. Corporal CARTER told Officer VANDERMEULEN that "some guy dressed in black had just pointed a gun" at him, and Corporal CARTER motioned toward Berrellesa and Buckley. Officer VANDERMEULEN stayed in his vehicle and drove in that direction while Corporal CARTER walked behind Officer VANDERMEULEN's patrol vehicle.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he resumed looking for the suspect and Corporal CARTER asked Officer VANDERMEULEN to join him down the hill so they did not get too far apart. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he then began backing down Buckley Street toward Corporal CARTER at which time the suspect SILVA suddenly ran around the corner at "full speed". Officer VANDERMEULEN said that SILVA ran southbound from Richardson onto Buckley and ran on a diagonal in the officer's direction.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that SILVA had his hands together in a two handed grip or stance like he was going to "shoot on the move." Officer VANDERMEULEN said that SILVA's behavior was "bizarre," and it seemed to Officer VANDERMEULEN that SILVA was running at the officer like he was "ready to engage." At the same time, Corporal CARTER said "that's him." Officer VANDEMEULEN could not recall if Corporal CARTER said this on the police radio or if the corporal had yelled this to him.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he was afraid that the suspect would engage him when the officer was still in his patrol car, so Officer VANDERMEULEN opened the front door to his patrol vehicle kicking it open with his foot and at the same time drawing his handgun.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that while SILVA was running, SILVA was using a "Weaver" type of stance, and the officer said that SILVA appeared to be "tracking him" with the weapon. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he yelled at SILVA to "drop your gun, drop your gun," however, SILVA did not.

SILVA then ran across the front of the patrol vehicle and ran to the bushes adjacent to 405 Richardson Street. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that once SILVA reached the bushes SILVA started popping in and out of the bushes and pointed the weapon at the officer using a "Weaver" type of grip.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he then fired two rounds at the suspect. Both rounds were fired from inside the officer's patrol vehicle. Corporal CARTER also fired. Officer VANDERMEULEN was not sure who fired the first rounds at the suspect (he or Corporal CARTER). Officer VANDERMEULEN said when the shots were fired, Corporal CARTER was on foot behind and to the left of Officer VANDERMEULEN's vehicle.

After the shooting, Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he got out of his patrol vehicle and waited for Sergeant PETERSON with the shield. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that at point, he along with Sergeant PETERSON, Officer MADSEN, and Corporal CARTER approached the downed suspect using the ballistic shield for cover.

Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he then handcuffed SILVA. I asked if anyone had administered first aid, and the officer said that no-one had as SILVA was dead as his eyes were completely dilated.

When asked to describe the time frame from the time he first challenged SILVA to the time he fired the shots, Officer VANDERMEULEN said it was "seconds." I also asked Officer VANDERMEULEN if he was fearful for his safety and the safety of his fellow officers due to the suspect's actions, and Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he was.

I asked the officer if he wore eyeglasses or contacts and Officer VANDERMEULEN said that he wears contacts which he was wearing at the time of the incident. In response to my questions, Officer VANDERMEULEN said that the only medication he had taken prior to this incident was

blood pressure medicine, and he said that he had not had any alcoholic beverages during the two days before this encounter.

Sergeant PETERSON then sought clarification on a couple of points from the officer. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that when he was backing down Buckley Street, SILVA suddenly appeared and pointed the gun at Officer VANDERMEULEN. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that because it appeared that the suspect was going to "engage" him, he turned the SUV to give himself a better tactical vantage point.

I asked Officer VANDERMEULEN what type of weapon the suspect had, and the officer said that it was a handgun, but, he could not recall the color. Attorney STERN then asked Officer VANDERMEULEN if the SUV was in park when the shots were fired, and Officer VANDERMEULEN confirmed that it was.

Sergeant SYLVIA then discussed Officer VANDERMEULEN's previous experience as a rangemaster, and the fact that the stances and hand motions utilized by SILVA during this incident are of the type generally used when firing weapons. Officer VANDERMEULEN confirmed that they were.

At that point I asked Officer VANDERMEULEN to prepare a diagram of the scene depicting the positions of the parties during pertinent times. The diagram is Evidence Item # PM-4. While drawing the diagram, Officer VANDERMEULEN further elaborated on the suspect's movements and motions at the time of this incident.

Officer VANDERMEULEN reiterated that the suspect came around the corner at a full run and ran diagonally to the bushes. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that as the suspect was running diagonally, the suspect did so in a "side gait" and continued to face the officer as he did.

At that point in the interview, I asked Officer VANDERMEULEN if there was anything that we had not discussed which he believed was important. Officer VANDERMEULEN reiterated that SILVA behavior was very purposeful and determined and that it looked like SILVA wanted a confrontation. The officer also mentioned that the officer's anxiety level was raised due to the fact that the SILVA was not at all deterred by fact the officer was pointing his weapon at him. When asked, Officer VANDERMEULEN said that the suspect never said anything to him at all.

In addition, Officer VANDERMEULEN reiterated that the suspect kept popping up and down and was "ground-hogging." He also said that at times the suspect had the gun in a "low-ready" position.

I then asked Officer VANDERMEULEN for a description of the suspect, and he described him as a white male with dark clothing, dark tee-shirt and black jeans, very slender. I also asked if the suspect had anything on his hands (e.g., gloves) and Officer VANDERMEULEN said that there was nothing on SILVA's hands.

Sergeant SYLVIA then asked Officer VANDERMEULEN what Corporal CARTER had told him at the start of this incident. Officer VANDERMEULEN said that Corporal CARTER told him "I think somebody just pointed a gun at me." Sergeant SYLVIA also asked Officer VANDERMEULEN to describe the gun and Officer VANDERMEULEN said it looked like an automatic.

The interview ended at 1435 hours.

Interview of MPD Sergeant Evert PRINS

Sergeant PETERSON and I interviewed Sergeant Evert PRINS, who was the on-duty patrol supervisor who responded to this incident. I was the primary interviewer. Sergeant PRINS said that he has been on the MPD for 22 years, and had been on duty since 0600 hours on the date of this incident.

Sergeant PRINS said that he first became involved in this incident when Corporal CARTER broadcast on his police radio a request for "Code 3" cover because he had been the victim of a brandishing. The sergeant responded to the scene from Victoria's Café, arriving within a minute. Upon arrival in the area of Alhambra and Marina Vista, the sergeant said he saw Corporal CARTER on foot carrying his patrol rifle. Sergeant PRINS said they began to set up a perimeter looking for the suspect who was described as being dressed all in black.

As they were setting up the perimeter, the sergeant said he heard 4-5 shots, at which point Sergeant PRINS said that he (PRINS) broadcast an Officer Needs Assistance call. When he heard the shots, Sergeant PRINS said he was at Marina Vista and Alhambra which is about two blocks from the scene. Sergeant PRINS said he immediately responded to the scene in patrol vehicle # 1236 which had the ballistic shield in the trunk. Sergeant PRINS said that he assumed a position of cover while four officers used the ballistic shield and approached the suspect. After

determining that the suspect no longer posed a threat, Sergeant PRINS said that Sergeant PETERSON immediately invoked the protocol. Sergeant PRINS then ensured that the scene was secure.

At that point the first interview with Sergeant PRINS was concluded.

Sergeant PETERSON and I subsequently learned that Sergeant PRINS had taken "Public Safety" Statements (per New York v. Quarles) from Corporal CARTER and Officer VANDERMEULEN immediately after this incident. Sergeant PETERSON and I briefly interviewed Sergeant PRINS about the conversations he had had with Corporal CARTER and Officer VANDERMEULEN after the shooting.

Sergeant PRINS said that Corporal CARTER told the sergeant that he thought he fired two rounds at the suspect. Sergeant PRINS then spoke to Officer VANDERMEULEN who described firing two shots at the suspect.

Sergeant PRINS also mentioned that while at the scene, he had taken the duty handgun from Officer VANDERMEULEN and the assault rifle from Corporal CARTER. At that point the second interview was concluded.

Autopsy of Robert SILVA

On 5-11-2006 Doctor Brian PETERSON performed the forensic autopsy on Robert SILVA. I attended along with Sergeant Gary PETERSON, Deputy District Attorney Bill CLARK, Deputy District Attorney Robert HOLE, and members of the Sheriff's Office forensics unit. The results of the autopsy will be documented in Doctor PETERSON's report.

Reenactment

On 5-12-2006, I went to the scene and met with Deputy District Attorney Bill CLARK, Sergeant PETERSON and other members of the Martinez Police Department. At 0840 hours (i.e., the same time as the shooting occurred on 5-10-2006), MPD Detective Kevin BUSCIGLIO wore a black shirt and did a limited reenactment of the suspect's movements as described by the officers involved in the incident. In addition, the MPD SUV which Officer VANDERMEULEN was driving on the date of the shooting was parked in the same position as it had been on the date of the incident.



Lieutenant Jackson told me that at approximately 0840 hours this date, two Officers with the Martinez Police Department were confronted by an unidentified armed suspect while investigating a man with a gun call in the 400 of Buckley Avenue. Lieutenant Jackson told me that as a result of this confrontation, shots were fired by the two Martinez Police Officers, and the unidentified male suspect was pronounced deceased at the scene. Lieutenant Jackson told me protocol had been enacted, and requested I respond to the location of occurrence and assist with this investigation.

When I arrived to the scene, I noted it had been secured by several uniformed Martinez Police Officers. I approached one of these Officers, and identified myself as being with the District Attorneys Office. I then entered the scene, where I met with DDA William Clark, and Senior Inspectors Paul Mulligan and Paul Peterson who was the "on-call" Senior Inspector representing our agency. For this reason, Senior Inspector Peterson was assigned as the lead investigator for this protocol.

After speaking briefly with Senior Inspector Peterson, I was met by Commander Tom Simonetti of the Martinez Police Department. I identified myself to Commander Simonetti, at which time he provided me with a brief synopsis of what had occurred. Commander Simonetti explained to me that two Martinez Police Officers he identified as Officer Jeff Vandermuelen and Corporal Brian Carter were involved in a shooting following a confrontation in the 400 block of Buckley Avenue. Commander Simonetti told me that neither Officer was injured as a result of this confrontation, however an unidentified white male suspect in his mid-twenties was pronounced deceased at the scene. Commander Simonetti told me that this confrontation occurred as both Officer Vandermuelen and Corporal Brian Carter were dispatched to this location to investigate a report of a man with a gun. Commander Simonetti told me that this incident occurred sometime after 8:30am this morning.

After speaking with Commander Simonetti, DDA Clark and myself were told that the deceased suspect was still on scene, and was located a half block west of our location behind an apartment complex located at 405 Buckley Avenue. DDA Clark and myself then walked to this location to look at the scene, and the condition of the deceased suspect.

When we arrived to this location, the suspect was covered with a yellow tarp, and was laying on the pedestrian walkway behind 405 Buckley Avenue which is a multi-unit dwelling for disabled adults. A Martinez Police Officer remained with the suspect at this location, and I asked this Officer if he recognized the suspect from prior contacts, and he told me "no". Most of the Martinez Police Officers at the scene during this time also indicated they did not recognize the responsible which is unusual for this location as it has a high concentration of transients who frequent the area. There are several multi-unit dwelling houses within this immediate vicinity which house disabled adults which is the reason for the more than normal transient population.

After speaking with the Martinez Officer on scene, I pulled the yellow tarp from the suspect(s) face to see if I recognized him, and to view his condition. I noted that the suspect was a white male appearing to be in his late twenties with a very slight build almost as if he was malnourished. The suspect was wearing all black clothing, including black cloth gloves on both hands. His black t-shirt had a silk screen photograph of "Che Guevara" on the front of the shirt,

and I saw what appeared to be a small hole which I believed was a bullet hole which penetrated the suspect's shirt at chest level.

On the pavement right of the suspect's head, I saw what first appeared as some sort of a machine pistol similar to that of a "Tec 9". The pistol was black in color, however as I kneeled down to get a better look at it, I realized that the magazine well of the weapon had a clear plastic magazine attached to it. Inside of the magazine were several small plastic pellets, which were orange in color. It was at this point, I realized that the weapon appeared as some type of "Air-Soft" type gun, however had I not kneeled down to get a better look, I would not had been able to make this distinction.

After walking through the scene with DDA Clark, he requested that I return back to the Martinez Police Department to attend an incident briefing regarding this incident. On arriving to the Police Department, we met with DDA Robert Hole who facilitated this briefing in conjunction with Sgt. Gary Peterson of the Martinez Police Department. At the time of this briefing, the suspect still remained identified.

Following the incident briefing, DDA Clark and DDA Hole assigned me and Detective Kevin Busciglio of the Martinez Police Department to attempt to identify the suspect. Following this identification, DDA Hole also requested we conduct the death notification with next of kin in addition to obtaining some background history on the suspect with family members and friends.

Immediately following our incident briefing, a Martinez Police employee approached Detective Busciglio and myself, and told me that there was a subject in the lobby of the police department who wanted to speak with us regarding this incident. According to the police employee, the subject in the lobby said he wanted to report missing, and had provided the police employee with a similar description of the suspect including that of the black t-shirt with the picture of "Che Guevara" on the front. For this reason, Detective Busciglio went down to the lobby and made contact with the subject identified as of Martinez.

Shortly after this contact, Detective Busciglio returned back to our briefing room, and told us that the subject in the lobby wanted to report missing. Detective Busciglio said that told him that he had heard about the shooting in his neighborhood this morning, and was concerned because Robert Silva was now missing and had not been heard from since 2am Tuesday morning. 





ultimately responded to the corner of Berrellesa and Buckley Streets, Martinez, where I was teamed with MPD Detective Aaron Roth. After walking the crime scene with and being briefed by responding Protocol Attorneys, Detectives and MPD scene coordinators, we were assigned to interview all the Tenants/staff of Scenic View (State License #075600001) who were present during the time of the incident. Scenic View is a care center for mentally ill patients. We ultimately identified several additional witnesses who had information significant to the investigation. Refer to witness list for specific names of witnesses. I recorded all interviews on a digital recorder. The recordings were transferred to three CD's which were submitted to evidence with this report. Detective Roth made cassette recordings of the interviews sans the interviews of Detective Roth submitted his recordings into MPD evidence.

saw Silva but otherwise saw no movement from Silva. Additionally he could see 3 to 5 police officers standing to the east by a police SUV that was parked in the middle of the street some 25 yards to the east. Could see the officers were pointing their weapons in the direction of the house. After a few minutes, saw the officer's move toward Silva using a "riot shield" for cover.

said he and were concerned the victim might be one of their residences so he went outside to the top of the stairs to see. He could see the subjects face, which was already discolored to the point where could not tell if the subject was white or Hispanic, and did not recognize the subject. While looking, saw what appeared to be a gun on the ground next to the right side of the subjects head. could also he what appeared to be a bullet whole in the chest of the subject.

remembers hearing the officers speaking but does not recall what they might have been saying. Saw the officers cuff the subject as they reached him. Could not see the subjects head at that time and does not know if the subject was receiving medical attention at that time. It was after the officers reached Silva that went outside to determine if he knew the subject.

Silva recalls seeing medical personnel arrive and begin providing medical assistance to Silva about 10 minutes after the shooting occurred. At no time did see any law enforcement personnel act inappropriately. I reviewed statement with him and concluded the interview at 1145 hours.

We then interviewed who is the Administrator at Scenic View. To oversees all the activities and care at Scenic View. He states Scenic View is a licensed board and care home for mentally ill patients with schizophrenic and bipolar disorders. facilities prior to and during the incident. states that most if not all of the patients have the ability to see and remember incidences, at least on a short term basis. The Patients have come and go privileges with evening curfews.

told us he was at his desk working on the northwest corner of the second floor at about 0845 hours when he heard 8 to 12 gunshots.

was asleep in the same room at the time. Said he jumped straight up and immediately went to the north window to see what was occurring. If irst saw several officers in and around a police SUV, all pointing their guns in the direction of the house. The vehicle was in the street about 25 yards down Buckley to the east. Upon seeing the officers with there weapons pointed in his general direction, immediately moved away from the window and had all the tenants who were awake and upstairs move into the office area.

After sequestering many of the tenants, which took "a couple minutes" and he felt there were going to be no more shots, looked back out the window. He said looked out the window at the same time. It was then he first saw Silva at the north east corner of his building. He said Silva's feet were facing east; could not see Silva's head. said Silva's left arm was "half way up in the air". the arm drop to the ground which was the last movement he saw from Silva. The Officers were still positioned at the Police vehicle with their guns drawn. does not believe, based on where the officers were, and the position Silva was on the ground, that the officers had a clear view of Silva. away from the window to deal with the tenants before the officers moved forward to Silva. was at the window and told the officers were moving forward.

different calibers because of the difference in sound of the shots. The remembers medical personnel arrived on scene and begin medical treatment. He said Silva was handcuffed in the front at the time. It did not hear any commotion prior to hearing the gunshots. He said the window was closed and the air conditioner was on at the time which drowns out most of the noise from outside. It did not open the window until the second time he went to the window. We concluded the interview at 1202 hours.

After concluding the interviews inside we went outside at which time pointed out an individual who was standing at the southwest corner of Buckley and Richardson. said the individual had been watching for quite some time and may have known Silva. Detective Roth and I went across the street and contacted was, at first, very hesitant to talk with us. It appeared he had an unknown issue with MPD. from two blocks away. He described the individual as a thin Mexican male approximately 5 foot 10 inches tall with glasses and wearing a black short sleeved t-shirt. The front of the T-shirt had an impression of a persons face. The individual on the T-shirt wore a bandana.

said he was in front of his house smoking a cigarette and talking with when he saw Robert Silva.

was leaning against his house facing south on Berrellesa Street when he first saw Silva walking north bound two blocks away at Green street on the east side of Berrellesa.

said he made no gestures toward Silva, said nothing to Silva and received no acknowledgment from Silva.

was adamant that I document the gun was a toy and that anyone could tell from a great distance it was a toy.

As stood at the corner after the incident he said he saw the coroner's office personnel move the decedent. over two blocks south on Berrellesa and across the street to the east but not North on Berrellesa without moving.

explained how he first saw Silva walking on the east side of the street at Green Street which is two blocks south. This time said he could only see Silva and not the gun.

pointed out a gray van approximately 50 yards away. He stated when he saw Silva reach that point he recognized Silva as the person he met the night before. As Siva was crossing the street and reaching the northeast corner of Berrellesa, recognized Silva was carrying a toy gun.

stated "it wasn't the first thing he expected to see early in the morning" a man in his mid twenties walking with a toy gun.

deck. said they could see officers pointing guns. I checked the view from this area. I could see just to the point where the MPD SUV had been parked just prior to the shooting. The house is set back from the others and the view is partially obstructed by various post plants etc. A person could see people in the street from this distance, which was almost two full blocks, but you cannot see 405 Richardson or the actual street much past Berrellesa. It would be difficult to make out weapons from this distance. said after about five ten minutes she saw the "SWAT team or something come out with their shields". said she could not see anyone other than the police and never saw the suspect. and continued to go in and out of the house to watch. She made several other statements regarding events that happened but when questioned it was revealed that most of what she knew was from what she was told and not what she actually saw.

At approximately hours we returned to Buckley and met with confirmed story that she had been asleep at the time the shooting occurred. woke up and went outside to the landing with said she could see officers with guns but could not see what they were doing or who they were confronting. Most of the information that had was what she learned from others. Even though told the press she had seen the entire incident she actually saw very little and was giving the press the information second hand.

I did not record this interview. The interview was recorded by Detective Roth on a cassette recorder. He booked this recording along with all the backup cassette recordings he made into Martinez evidence.



REPORT OF FIELD SERVICES:

On 5/10/06, at approximately 0930 hours I was informed by Senior Clerk Patricia Olmstead of an officer involved shooting in Martinez. Sergeant Simonette requested our assistance to document the scene and collect evidence.

Lab Aide Rosary Marcelo and I gathered our equipment and responded to the scene. The scene is located on Buckley Street between Berrellesa and Richardson in Martinez. The scene was secured by Officers, crime scene tape, and patrol cars.

Various officers and DA investigators briefed us on what had occurred:

At roughly 0845 hours Richard Silva approached a man in a car in the parking lot by the corner of Alhambra and Escobar. Silva knocked on the window and the man opened the door. Silva pointed a gun at the man and said "Today is your last day on earth". Silva then pulled the trigger twice and the man ducked down to avoid the gun. The man said the gun did not go off and Silva ran away. The man said the gun looked like a Tec-9 or something similar. The man said he heard the gun click twice but it did not fire. The man yelled to others in the construction crew office to call 911. Martinez police responded and found Silva on Buckley. One officer was on foot the other driving a SUV. As the officers approached Silva he pointed a firearm at them and they fired at him. They took cover behind the SUV and waited for a shield to approach Silva who had disappeared behind a hedge. They approached and found Silva dead behind the hedge.

We did a quick survey of the scene. Three fired cartridge cases were observed in the north gutter east of the SUV. Three cartridge cases were located in the SUV and another cartridge case under the SUV. Suspected bullet impacts were observed on the stucco wall of the house on the southeast corner of Buckley and Richardson. Silva's body was present on his back below the rear staircase next to the wall. Criminalist Alex Taflya and Crime Scene Investigator Carolyn Crain arrived to assist. Taflya began taking overall photographs. I rendered both officers' guns safe and packaged them for transport. I received the guns from the Watch Commander's car at the scene. All four of us searched Buckley Street for bullets and bullet fragments. A fired bullet was located in the intersection of Buckley and Richardson. A rusty ball bearing was also located and collected, but is most likely not involved. No other bullets or fragments were recovered.

The Coroner arrived and Silva's body was examined. He has a bullet entrance wound to the center of his chest. He was rolled over and an exit wound and a grazing wound were observed on his back. We assisted the coroner's in placing Silva in a body bag and he was removed from the scene to the Morgue.

We used Lead Check Swabs to test the impacts to the wall. The Lead Check Swabs tested positive with known lead and negative on control areas on the wall. Several of the impacts tested positive. A couple suspected areas tested negative as did two of the impact sites. The two impacts that tested negative did so due to the amount of material ejected from the impact site after being struck (transferred lead ejected out with stucco). We marked evidence with numbered cones and took photographs. We then marked evidence locations and bullet impacts on the wall with blue paint. Crain and Marcelo then departed the scene to meet with a helicopter from East Bay Regional Parks. The helicopter took them up and Crain took aerial photographs of the scene. Taflya and I collected the evidence and took measurements of the scene. Rough sketches of the scene and wall were prepared.

Both officers were brought back to the scene and told me from where they fired shots. I noted where they said they were with where evidence was located. The evidence corresponds very closely to where the officers said they were.

With nothing further we departed the scene.

The Beretta pistol had one cartridge in the chamber and seven in the magazine (total of 8 out of a possible 12 rounds). Standard procedure at Martinez PD is to top off magazine after charging pistol for 12 rounds. With the four fired rounds 12 rounds accounted for.

The Colt carbine had one cartridge in the chamber and 23 in the magazine (total of 24 out of a possible 31). Standard procedure at Martinez PD is to down load magazine two rounds and leave chamber empty until needed for 28 rounds. With the three fired rounds 27 rounds accounted for. Magazine has good, tight springs so 27 rounds is possible.

EXAMINATION:

The pellet gun was transferred to Lead Fingerprint Examiner Cindy Hull for latent print processing on 5/10/06. She returned the pellet gun to me on 5/11/06. The pellet gun was examined. It was plugged with dirt. The dirt was cleared from the barrel. I examined the pellet gun with a borescope and discovered that one of the pellets was stuck in the feed area and that pellets were not feeding into the barrel so they would fire. The pellet was

dislodged and the pellet gun worked normally after that. The pellet gun is not very powerful and pellets only travel about 10 feet once fired from the gun.

Both the Beretta pistol and the Colt carbine were test-fired at the Sheriff's Range to determine approximate ejection patterns when held normally with two handed grips. Both eject cartridge cases slightly back and to the right. Ejection patterns are consistent with what was observed at the scene and with what officers told us.

DISPOSITION:

On 5/11/06, the pellet gun was placed into Escobar Return for pickup.

On 5/15/06, the officer's guns were placed into Escobar Return for pickup.

On 5/19/06, the other evidence was placed into the Evidence Room pending additional analysis. The images were burned to CD's and a copy was placed into the Photograph File and a copy was sent to Martinez Police Department Investigations.

REPORT OF FIELD SERVICES:

On May 11, 2006, I was requested by Supervising Criminalist P. Holes to document the autopsy of Robert Silva who had reportedly been shot while brandishing a weapon at police on Buckley Street in Martinez. Refer to Laboratory report 06-5481-1 for details regarding the scene processing. Laboratory Aide R. Marcelo was assigned to assist. We arrived at the Coroner's Office at approximately 7:50 AM. The autopsy was performed by Dr. B. Peterson and Pathologist Assistant S. Jagoda.

According to Martinez P.D. Sergeant T. Simonette, Silva had a handgun, approached a construction worker who was seated in his vehicle, and threatened to shoot him. REPORT OF FIELD SERVICES:

On 5/10/06, at approximately 0930 hours I was informed by Senior Clerk Patricia Olmstead of an officer involved shooting in Martinez. Sergeant Simonette requested our assistance to document the scene and collect evidence.

Lab Aide Rosary Marcelo and I gathered our equipment and responded to the scene. The scene is located on Buckley Street between Berrellesa and Richardson in Martinez. The scene was secured by Officers, crime scene tape, and patrol cars.

Various officers and DA investigators briefed us on what had occurred:

At roughly 0845 hours Richard Silva approached a man in a car in the parking lot by the corner of Alhambra and Escobar. Silva knocked on the window and the man opened the door. Silva pointed a gun at the man and said "Today is your last day on earth". Silva then pulled the trigger twice and the man ducked down to avoid the gun. The man said the gun did not go off and Silva ran away. The man said the gun looked like a Tec-9 or something similar. The man said he heard the gun click twice but it did not fire. The man yelled to others in the construction crew office to call 911. Martinez police responded and found Silva on Buckley. One officer was on foot the other driving a SUV. As the officers approached Silva he pointed a firearm at them and they fired at him. They took cover behind the SUV and waited for a shield to approach Silva who had disappeared behind a hedge. They approached and found Silva dead behind the hedge.

We did a quick survey of the scene. Three fired cartridge cases were observed in the north gutter east of the SUV. Three cartridge cases were located in the SUV and another cartridge case under the SUV. Suspected bullet impacts were observed on the stucco wall of the house on the southeast corner of Buckley and Richardson. Silva's body was present on his back below the rear staircase next to the wall. Criminalist Alex Taflya and Crime Scene Investigator Carolyn Crain arrived to assist. Taflya began taking overall photographs. I rendered both officers' guns safe and packaged them for transport. I received the guns from the Watch Commander's car at the scene. All four of us searched Buckley Street for bullets and bullet fragments. A fired bullet was located in the intersection of Buckley and Richardson. A rusty ball bearing was also located and collected, but is most likely not involved. No other bullets or fragments were recovered.

The Coroner arrived and Silva's body was examined. He has a bullet entrance wound to the center of his chest. He was rolled over and an exit wound and a grazing wound were observed on his back. We assisted the coroner's in placing Silva in a body bag and he was removed from the scene to the Morgue.

We used Lead Check Swabs to test the impacts to the wall. The Lead Check Swabs tested positive with known lead and negative on control areas on the wall. Several of the impacts tested positive. A couple suspected areas tested negative as did two of the impact sites. The two impacts that tested negative did so due to the amount of material ejected from the impact site after being struck (transferred lead ejected out with stucco). We marked evidence with numbered cones and took photographs. We then marked evidence locations and bullet impacts on the wall with blue paint. Crain and Marcelo then departed the scene to meet with a helicopter from East Bay Regional Parks. The helicopter took them up and Crain took aerial photographs of the scene. Taflya and I collected the evidence and took measurements of the scene. Rough sketches of the scene and wall were prepared.

Both officers were brought back to the scene and told me from where they fired shots. I noted where they said they were with where evidence was located. The evidence corresponds very closely to where the officers said they were.

It was plugged with dirt. The dirt was cleared from the barrel. I examined the pellet gun with a borescope and discovered that one of the pellets was stuck in the feed area and that pellets were not feeding into the barrel so they would fire. The pellet was

Both eject cartridge cases slightly back and to the right. Ejection patterns are consistent with what was observed at the scene and with what officers told us.

The Toxicology report documented that SILVA's body contained no blood alcohol but showed a positive result for Delta-9 THC (Active ingredient for Marijuana). The above reports were placed into the case file for this report.

I received a phone call from Martinez Police Department Dispatch in regards to an Officer involved shooting that occurred on this date. Dispatch requested the Coroner's presence (per Sgt Richardson Martinez PD) at Buckley St @ Richardson Street in the City of Martinez.

Deputy Biggs and I arrived onscene at 1135 hrs. While on scene I noticed the decedent laying on the sidewalk near some concrete steps near an apartment building. I also noticed that near the decedent was a weapon (laying on the step), upon closer inspection of the weapon it appeared to be a black in color handgun(possible replica). After looking at the scene, I asked the Contra Costa County Crime lab to determine if the decedent had been identified. The Crime Lab and Martinez PD told me that the decedent had not been identified at this time. I then spoke with Martinez Police Sgt. Princs in regards to this detail and Deputy Biggs provided assistance by taking photographs of the scene. Also Sgt. Forsyth (Coroner's supervisor) arrived and took photographs of this incident.

Sgt. Princs told me that earlier this morning the decedent (later identified as Robert Andrew Silva) brandished a weapon at Corporal Carter (Martinez Police Department) at the coroner of Alhambra Ave and Escobar Street in the City of Martinez. After the weapon was brandished, the decedent fled the scene, Corporal Carter advised Dispatch that a weapon was brandished at him and radioed for assistance (Code 3 cover). Shortly after he (Carter) and Officer Vandermeulen canvassed the area for the decedent. The decedent was then seen at the corner of Buckley Street and Richardson Street (City of Martinez, approximately 1 block from Alhambra and Escobar). The Martinez Police Officers attempted to make contact with the decedent. Shortly after making contact with the decedent, the Martinez Officer engaged the decedent and fired upon the decedent. Sgt. Princs could not provide details in regards to what led the Officers to fire upon the decedent. Sgt. Princs told me that Corporal Carter's weapon was an AR-15 and that Officer Vandermeulen's weapon was a 40 caliber Beretta. Sgt. Princs could not provide any information on how many rounds (bullets) were fired in this incident.

Sgt. Princs had no other information to provide at this time. I was not able to speak to Detective Sgt. Peterson and Detective Maloney due to the fact that they were not on scene and was busy with other aspects of this Officer involved incident.

After I was finished speaking to Sgt Princs, I made contact with the Office of the Sheriff Crime Lab technicians who were on scene. I was advised that the decedent was fingerprinted and palm printed for identification purposes. I asked the Techs if they would also measure the distance from where the Officer's vehicle was at it's point of rest to where the decedent was laying. The distance to where the Martinez Officer's vehicle was at (where the Officer's engaged the decedent) and where the decedent was laying was

approximately seventy feet and one inches (the measurement was taken via roll-a-tape).

After the measurement was taken, Inspector Hole and Deputy DA Clark wanted to see where rounds (bullets) entered the decedent. Inspection of the decedent showed that a round entered the upper center chest area and an exit wound was present in the right lower part of the decedent's shoulder blade area. There was a tear on the back of the decedent's right shoulder area and internal body pieces within the shirt area.

Prior to leaving the scene, Deputy D.A Clark told me that Inspector Wasteney was in the process of getting the decedent identified and believed that the decedent was a Robert Andrew Silva. Clark said that photo identified the decedent. Clark then provided me with Wasteney's contact information and advised that I could get information from him.

After the District Attorney inspectors looked at the decedent, they advised that there was no other need for the decedent to still be on scene. I verified that Martinez PD did not need the decedent. After all information was gathered, and verifying that all agencies were finished with the decedent, Deputy Biggs and I gathered the decedent and transported the decedent back to the Coroner's office.

While at the Coroner's office the decedent was weighed, tagged and x-rayed prior to being stored for examination on 05/11/06.

After storing the decedent I contact Inspector Wasteney in regards to the identification of the decedent. Wasteney told me that was to the decedent and that identified the decedent via a photograph identification. Wasteney also told me that just recently came back from Las Vegas and that while in Las Vegas the decedent left his wallet there. brought the wallet back to Martinez and was going to give it to Robert. Wasteney told me that gave him the wallet and within the wallet was a
Robert. Wasteney told me that gave him the wallet and within the wallet was a photo of Robert Andrew Silva.

Wasteney also provided me with next of kin information and that he was going to fly to Henderson Nevada to contact the decedent's Wasteney told me that he would contact the Coroner's Office when he made official notification. Wasteney had no other information to provide at this time.

After speaking to Wasteney I checked RMS for any identification information pertaining to the decedent. I was able to find an expired/surrendered (to Nevada) California DMV information pertaining to the decedent. I asked Sgt. Forsyth to provide me with a California DMV Photo /Soundex information so I could see a photo of the individual assigned to this license. Shortly after, Sgt Forsyth provided me the photograph, fingerprint

and information pertaining to the license. The photo looked liked the decedent.

I contacted Debbie Clark of the Crime Lab in regards to the fingerprints taken of the decedent, and provided her with the name and date of birth of the decedent. Shortly after Debbie Clark called back and verbally told me that the decedent was a Robert Andrew Silva (DOB: 01/08/1979) and that the decedent's fingerprint matched the DMV fingerprint.

I advised Inspector Wasteney of the positive identification of the decedent.

No other information at this time.

X-RAYS

Five digital x-rays are reviewed, including a film of the left side of the chest and upper arm, right side of the chest and upper arm, mid torso, and two films of the head. With the exception of jewelry, no additional metallic densities are identified.

The body is received in an intact pouch. The body is in the supine position, with the hands handcuffed over the anterior surface of the torso. In the bag with the body is a pair of eyeglasses. The neck is encircled by a necklace, consisting of light brown wooden beads and yellow metal. Also within the bag but not on the body are a pair of black cloth gloves.

CLOTHING

The body is clad in a black short sleeved tee shirt with "Che Guevera" photographed on the chest; a bullet hole is in the center portion of Che's beret. Beneath the black short sleeved tee shirt is a white tee shirt. Additional clothing consists of blue denim trousers secured by a dark brown leather belt, multicolored boxer shorts, white socks, and gray and white athletic shoes. The shoe and sock have been previously removed from the left foot to allow placement of a body identification tag. Additional holes on the posterior surface of the tee shirt correspond to gunshot injuries to be described further below.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY

EKG patches are on the forearms.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The fully clad, cool, unembalmed body is that of a mildly cachectic, well developed, male, which measures approximately 69 inches, weighs 103 pounds, and appears consistent with the listed age of 27 years. The scalp hair is brown, straight and up to 1 inch in length. The irides are gray the corneas are clear, and the sclerae and conjunctivae are unremarkable. The dentition is natural and in good repair. There is no external injury of the ears, nose, or lips. The neck is unremarkable externally. Injuries of the chest will be described below. The abdomen is scaphoid. The external genitalia are those of a circumcised adult male with bilaterally descended testes. Examination of the extremities reveals a monochrome tattoo on the right shoulder consisting of an eagle and the letters USMC. On the left shoulder is a tattoo of a dragon and the letters SILVA. The extremities are otherwise unremarkable, specifically; there is no evidence of old or recent incision on the wrists or forearms. The anus is unremarkable. Lividity is dorsal and fixed except in areas exposed to pressure, and rigor mortis is full in the extremities, but easily overcome.

EVIDENCE OF INJURY

The following numbers and/or letters are assigned to the following injuries for record keeping purposes and do not necessarily reflect order of fire.

- 1. Perforating Gunshot Wound, Chest: 16 inches below the vertex, 3 ½ inches below the suprasternal notch, ¼ inch above a line connecting the nipples, and beginning at the anterior midline extending slightly to the right is an oval, indeterminate range, gunshot wound of entrance. The circular portion of the wound measures ½ inch in diameter, and is surrounded by elliptical tearing and abrasion from 2 o'clock to 8 o'clock, making the total measurement of the wound in this axis 1 ¼ inches. This abrasion pattern indicates that passage into the chest is left to right and downward. This entrance wound is designated letter A. 22 inches below the vertex, 11 inches below the right acromioclavicular joint and 5 inches to the right of the posterior midline is a stellate exit wound, designated letter B. This injury measures ½ inch in greatest dimension. The trajectory from letter A to B is downward, front to back, and left to right.
- 2. <u>Graze Wound, Left Shoulder</u>: 12 inches below the vertex, 4 inches below the left acromioclavicular joint and 4 ½ inches to the left of the posterior midline is an elliptical graze-type gunshot wound. This wound is designated letter **C**. The range is indeterminate, and it measures 3 x 1 ½ inches. Examination of skin tags at the margins of the injury indicates the bullet passage is right to left.

INTERNAL EXAMINATION

BODY CAVITIES

The body is opened using the usual Y-shaped and intermastoid incisions, and the chest plate is removed. There are no adhesions in the pericardial, pleural, or peritoneal spaces. All body organs are in the normal anatomic position. The midline anterior abdominal fat layer measures ½ inch.

INTERNAL EVIDENCE OF INJURY

Once the soft tissue of the chest is reflected, a gunshot injury is found involving the lateral sternum and proximal cartilage of right rib #4. A hemorrhagic wound passes through the pericardial sac, the junction of the inferior vena cava, and right atrium, right middle lobe, right lower lobe, to exit through rib #11 posteriorly, again, the trajectory is front to back, downward, and right to left. There is a right hemothorax.

SYSTEMS REVIEW

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM

Removal of the calvarium reveals an intact dura mater, with no evidence of epidural or subdural hemorrhage. The external surface of the 1400 gram brain is symmetrical, with no evidence of subarachnoid hemorrhage. Coronal sections through the cerebrum reveal no focal lesions, and transverse sections through the cerebellum and brainstem are unremarkable. The structures at the base of the brain, including blood vessels and cranial nerves are intact.

NECK

Examination of the soft tissues of the neck, including strap muscles, thyroid gland, and large vessels, reveals no abnormalities. The hyoid bone, thyroid and cricoid cartilages are intact.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT

The mucosa of the esophagus, stomach, and duodenum is intact; the gastric lumen is empty. The small and large bowel are unremarkable. The appendix is present.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM

See "Evidence of Injury". The external surface of the 190 gram heart is otherwise unremarkable. Serial sections through the right dominant coronary arteries reveal that they are patent, without significant atherosclerosis or thrombus. Sections through the myocardium reveal that the uninjured myocardium is uniformly red-brown and firm. With the exception of the gunshot injury, the chambers and valves are unremarkable. The great vessels exit and return to the heart in a normal distribution and are unobstructed.

RESPIRATORY SYSTEM

See "Evidence of Injury". The mucosal of the larynx, trachea, and bronchi are pink-tan and unremarkable. The normally lobated lungs are covered by glistening pleural surfaces except where injured. Sections on the left reveal a dry well-aerated parenchyma, while sections on the right reveal a hemorrhagic parenchyma in keeping with bullet passage. The pulmonary arteries and veins are normally distributed and unobstructed. The right lung weighs 210 grams and the left lung weighs 240 grams.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM

The liver weighs 750 grams and is covered by a glistening, intact capsule. Sections reveal a dark redbrown uniform parenchyma. The extrahepatic biliary tree is normally distributed and unobstructed. The

gallbladder contains approximately 20 ml of yellow liquid bile. The pancreatic parenchyma is yellow-tan and lobular and the ducts are clear.

RETICULO-LYMPHATIC SYSTEM

The 110 gram spleen is covered by a wrinkled, intact, gray capsule. Sections reveal a normal parenchyma with a normal distribution of white and red pulp. The regional lymph nodes and bone marrow are grossly unremarkable.

GENITOURINARY SYSTEM

The renal capsules are smooth, thin, and semi-transparent, and strip with ease to reveal a smooth, redbrown cortical surface. The cortex is slightly congested and measures up to 0.6 cm in thickness, and is sharply delineated from the unremarkable medulla and collecting system. The ureters follow the normal course to the urinary bladder, which contains approximately 20 ml of yellow, clear urine. Each kidney weighs 120 grams. The prostate gland and testes are normal to palpation.

MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM

There are no bone or joint abnormalities. The skeletal muscle is red-brown and firm.

ENDOCRINE SYSTEM


The pituitary, thyroid, and adrenal glands are normal in size, shape, and location.

approximately seventy feet and one inches (the measurement was taken via roll-a-tape).

After the measurement was taken, Inspector Hole and Deputy DA Clark wanted to see where rounds (bullets) entered the decedent. Inspection of the decedent showed that a round entered the upper center chest area and an exit wound was present in the right lower part of the decedent's shoulder blade area. There was a tear on the back of the decedent's right shoulder area and internal body pieces within the shirt area.

Prior to leaving the scene, Deputy D.A Clark told me that Inspector Wasteney was in the process of getting the decedent identified and believed that the decedent was a Robert Andrew Silva. Clark said that the decedent identified and believed that the decedent was a Robert photo identified the decedent. Clark then provided me with Wasteney's contact information and advised that I could get information from him.

After the District Attorney inspectors looked at the decedent, they advised that there was no other need for the decedent to still be on scene. I verified that Martinez PD did not need the decedent. After all information was gathered, and verifying that all agencies were finished with the decedent, Deputy Biggs and I gathered the decedent and transported the decedent back to the Coroner's office.

While at the Coroner's office the decedent was weighed, tagged and x-rayed prior to being stored for examination on 05/11/06.

After storing the decedent I contact Inspector Wasteney in regards to the identification of the decedent. Wasteney told me that dentified the decedent via a photograph identification. Wasteney also told me that just recently came back from Las Vegas and that while in Las Vegas the decedent left his wallet there. Shought the wallet back to Martinez and was going to give it to Robert. Wasteney told me that gave him the wallet and within the wallet was a photo of Robert Andrew Silva.

Wasteney also provided me with next of kin information and that he was going to fly to Henderson Nevada to contact the decedent's father, Joey Silva. Wasteney told me that he would contact the Coroner's Office when he made official notification. Wasteney had no other information to provide at this time.

After speaking to Wasteney I checked RMS for any identification information pertaining to the decedent. I was able to find an expired/surrendered (to Nevada) California DMV information pertaining to the decedent. I asked Sgt. Forsyth to provide me with a California DMV Photo /Soundex information so I could see a photo of the individual assigned to this license. Shortly after, Sgt Forsyth provided me the photograph, fingerprint

X-RAYS

Five digital x-rays are reviewed, including a film of the left side of the chest and upper arm, right side of the chest and upper arm, mid torso, and two films of the head. With the exception of jewelry, no additional metallic densities are identified.

The body is received in an intact pouch. The body is in the supine position, with the hands handcuffed over the anterior surface of the torso. In the bag with the body is a pair of eyeglasses. The neck is encircled by a necklace, consisting of light brown wooden beads and yellow metal. Also within the bag but not on the body are a pair of black cloth gloves.

CLOTHING

The body is clad in a black short sleeved tee shirt with "Che Guevera" photographed on the chest; a bullet hole is in the center portion of Che's beret. Beneath the black short sleeved tee shirt is a white tee shirt. Additional clothing consists of blue denim trousers secured by a dark brown leather belt, multicolored boxer shorts, white socks, and gray and white athletic shoes. The shoe and sock have been previously removed from the left foot to allow placement of a body identification tag. Additional holes on the posterior surface of the tee shirt correspond to gunshot injuries to be described further below.

EVIDENCE OF MEDICAL THERAPY

EKG patches are on the forearms.

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION

The fully clad, cool, unembalmed body is that of a mildly cachectic, well developed, male, which measures approximately 69 inches, weighs 103 pounds, and appears consistent with the listed age of 27 years. The scalp hair is brown, straight and up to 1 inch in length. The irides are gray the corneas are clear, and the sclerae and conjunctivae are unremarkable. The dentition is natural and in good repair. There is no external injury of the ears, nose, or lips. The neck is unremarkable externally. Injuries of the chest will be described below. The abdomen is scaphoid. The external genitalia are those of a circumcised adult male with bilaterally descended testes. Examination of the extremities reveals a monochrome tattoo on the right shoulder consisting of an eagle and the letters USMC. On the left shoulder is a tattoo of a dragon and the letters SILVA. The extremities are otherwise unremarkable, specifically; there is no evidence of old or recent incision on the wrists or forearms. The anus is unremarkable. Lividity is dorsal and fixed except in areas exposed to pressure, and rigor mortis is full in the extremities, but easily overcome.

SYSTEMS REVIEW

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM

Removal of the calvarium reveals an intact dura mater, with no evidence of epidural or subdural hemorrhage. The external surface of the 1400 gram brain is symmetrical, with no evidence of subarachnoid hemorrhage. Coronal sections through the cerebrum reveal no focal lesions, and transverse sections through the cerebellum and brainstem are unremarkable. The structures at the base of the brain, including blood vessels and cranial nerves are intact.

NECK

Examination of the soft tissues of the neck, including strap muscles, thyroid gland, and large vessels, reveals no abnormalities. The hyoid bone, thyroid and cricoid cartilages are intact.

GASTROINTESTINAL TRACT

The mucosa of the esophagus, stomach, and duodenum is intact; the gastric lumen is empty. The small and large bowel are unremarkable. The appendix is present.

CARDIOVASCULAR SYSTEM

See "Evidence of Injury". The external surface of the 190 gram heart is otherwise unremarkable. Serial sections through the right dominant coronary arteries reveal that they are patent, without significant atherosclerosis or thrombus. Sections through the myocardium reveal that the uninjured myocardium is uniformly red-brown and firm. With the exception of the gunshot injury, the chambers and valves are unremarkable. The great vessels exit and return to the heart in a normal distribution and are unobstructed.


RESPIRATORY SYSTEM

See "Evidence of Injury". The mucosal of the larynx, trachea, and bronchi are pink-tan and unremarkable. The normally lobated lungs are covered by glistening pleural surfaces except where injured. Sections on the left reveal a dry well-aerated parenchyma, while sections on the right reveal a hemorrhagic parenchyma in keeping with bullet passage. The pulmonary arteries and veins are normally distributed and unobstructed. The right lung weighs 210 grams and the left lung weighs 240 grams.

HEPATOBILIARY SYSTEM

The liver weighs 750 grams and is covered by a glistening, intact capsule. Sections reveal a dark redbrown uniform parenchyma. The extrahepatic biliary tree is normally distributed and unobstructed. The

Examination Results:

The Beretta pistol was examined and no unusual wear, damage, or alterations were found. The designed safeties and controls functioned normally. The measured single action trigger pull was 5½ pounds; the double action pull was 10 pounds. The pistol functioned normally when test-fired and the test-fires were retained by the laboratory. The pistol has 6 right rifling and a hemispherical firing pin.

The Colt rifle was examined and no unusual wear, damage, or alterations were found. The designed safeties and controls functioned normally. The measured single action trigger pull was 7 pounds. The rifle functioned normally when test-fired and the test-fires were retained by the laboratory. The rifle has 6 right rifling and a hemispherical firing pin.

The fired bullet was examined and determined to be a 180 grain, .40 caliber HST copper jacketed hollow point bullet marketed by Federal with 6 right rifling impressions.

The fired cartridge cases were examined. Items #9-3 to 9-6 were determined to be .40 S&W cartridge cases marketed by Federal with hemispherical firing pin impressions. Items #9-7 to 9-9 were determined to be .223 Remington cartridge cases marketed by Lake City Arsenal with hemispherical firing pin impressions. All of the cases are nickel plated brass with nickel plated brass primers.

The evidence bullet was compared to the test-fired bullets from the Beretta pistol. Sufficient agreement in class and individual characteristics was observed between the land impressions to conclude that the bullet was fired from the Beretta pistol.

The evidence .40 S&W cartridge cases were microscopically compared to the test-fired cases from the Beretta pistol. Sufficient agreement in class and individual characteristics was observed between the firing pin impressions and magazine marks to conclude that the cases were fired from the Beretta pistol.

The evidence .223 Remington cartridge cases were microscopically compared to the test-fired cases from the Colt rifle. All class characteristics agree and there is some agreement in individual characteristics but an insufficient amount for a conclusive identification. The test-fires from the Colt rifle exhibited the same quality of individual marks as the evidence cases.
