RESOLUTION NO. 025-17

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARTINEZ DECLARING THE CITY OF MARTINEZ'S COMMITMENT TO BEING AN INCLUSIVE, TOLERANT, AND SUPPORTIVE COMMUNITY FOR EVERYONE

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez is committed to serving and protecting all of its residents with a high value placed on diversity, equality, and inclusivity; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez is a City that supports the protection of human rights, public safety, and social well-being for all residents, as well as those that conduct business, work, visit, or pass through the City of Martinez; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez promotes safety, a sense of security, and the equal protection of Constitutional rights of all people; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes and affirms that the City of Martinez is a community that is committed to equality as well as a City which celebrates diversity and tolerance; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez values the contributions and traditions of all cultures; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez is a supportive community that treats all residents equally; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez Police Department is committed to protecting and maintaining a safe and secure environment that enhances the quality of life for everyone in our community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez will not inquire upon a resident's immigration status in either provision of municipal services or in the course of law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez seeks to continue to foster trust between City officials and residents to encourage cooperation between residents and City Officials, including law enforcement and employees, and to ensure public safety and due process for all; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez Police Department shall not arrest or detain any person solely for violations pertaining to immigration status; and

WHEREAS, the City of Martinez supports Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agents removing the word, "Police" on their uniforms and not displaying any insignia that would cause the public to believe they are local police officers, rather than Immigration and Customs Enforcement Federal Agents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council that we are firm in our commitment to ensure that all people residing in, working, visiting, and passing through the City of Martinez be safe, treated with dignity, and treated equally.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that due to the complexity of Federal civil immigration laws and the laws of the State of California, the need to promote trust and cooperation from the public, including immigrants, and to attain the City's objectives, the City Council seeks to clarify through this resolution the alignment with State Law including, the TRUST Act, that the communication and the enforcement relationship between the City and the Federal government shall fall within the following guidelines:

- A. The City shall not request or maintain information on the citizenship or immigration status of any person unless such inquiry is required by state law, federal law, or judicial decision.
- B. The City shall not expend resources to conduct sweeps or other concentrated efforts for the purpose of locating and/or detaining persons who are solely suspected of being illegally present in the United States.


